# Boom time

**Robin James** reports on a year in which membership enquiries and acceptance peaked, sales of TG20:13 soared and the value of NASC membership reached scaffolding companies of all sizes.

Welcome to another edition of a perennial industry favourite, the NASC 2017 Yearbook. Thanks are due to all NASC members who have supported this remarkable publication by submitting project news editorial items and images, also of course to those members who have participated by providing an incredible array of advertising.

Once again the NASC 2017 Yearbook testifies to a healthy and dynamic industry, and one that continues to astonish and amaze. The range and quality of work carried out by NASC member companies in the access and scaffolding sector simply underlines the importance of maintaining the highest possible standards where requirements for NASC membership are concerned.

Pausing to reflect on another year of vigorous and wide-ranging activity, it is pleasing to see that an initiative by the Confederation to attract smaller scaffolding contractors into membership, launched by the incoming NASC President Alan Lilley at the AGM in 2015, is now beginning to bear fruit.

NASC full membership is at an all time high. Enquiries and applications are also on the increase, and not just at the SME end of the scale. It is gratifying to note that a number of larger scaffolding organisations have also sought to obtain NASC membership in 2016.

Over the past 12 months the Confederation has taken steps to demonstrate to industry that NASC membership is available to all scaffold contractors, whatever their size, which are able to show, at audit, that they comply with exacting criteria.

Direct employment of scaffolding operatives (75% minimum) and minimum CISRS carded scaffolder training requirements are key differentiators which continue to set NASC members apart. Successful applicants undergo a rigorous examination, not just at time of application, but also by site audit. Existing NASC members are audited on a regular basis to ensure that compliance is maintained.

In 2017 the Confederation will continue its drive to attract smaller companies into membership by arranging seminars across the UK. These seminars will introduce potential members to the benefits of

membership and will include presentations about NASC guidance, including TG20:13 Good Practice Guidance for Tube and Fitting Scaffolding.

TG20:13 was launched in February 2014. Continuing and buoyant sales of this flagship industry guidance demonstrate that TG20, like SG4 before it, has now 'bedded in', not just to the scaffolding industry but to the construction sector as a whole. The confederation will engage with the temporary works departments of principal contractors in 2017 to promote the adoption of TG20 by industry.

Following a consultation exercise with TG20 purchasers and end users during the summer of 2016 a working group has met to consider a wide range of responses. It is envisaged that 'quick wins' will be implemented in the short term by way of an upgrade to the existing software. In the longer term more far-reaching enhancements will be incorporated to a revised version of TG20.

TG20 is but one aspect of a huge suite

of industry guidance which is issued by NASC. Members of NASC standing committees work tirelessly to ensure that the membership and the industry as a whole are able to benefit from their diligence. The confederation is extremely grateful to these individuals who give freely of their experience and expertise for the benefit of all.

In conclusion, a word of thanks to the NASC regions and their chairs. NASC regional meetings in 2016 were notable for good attendance, constructive debate and dialogue, and excellent suggestions. Feedback is tabled at standing committee meetings and this cycle demonstrates the importance of engaging with the grass roots of the NASC membership, ultimately driving up industry standards for the benefit of the members and the construction sector as a whole. ■

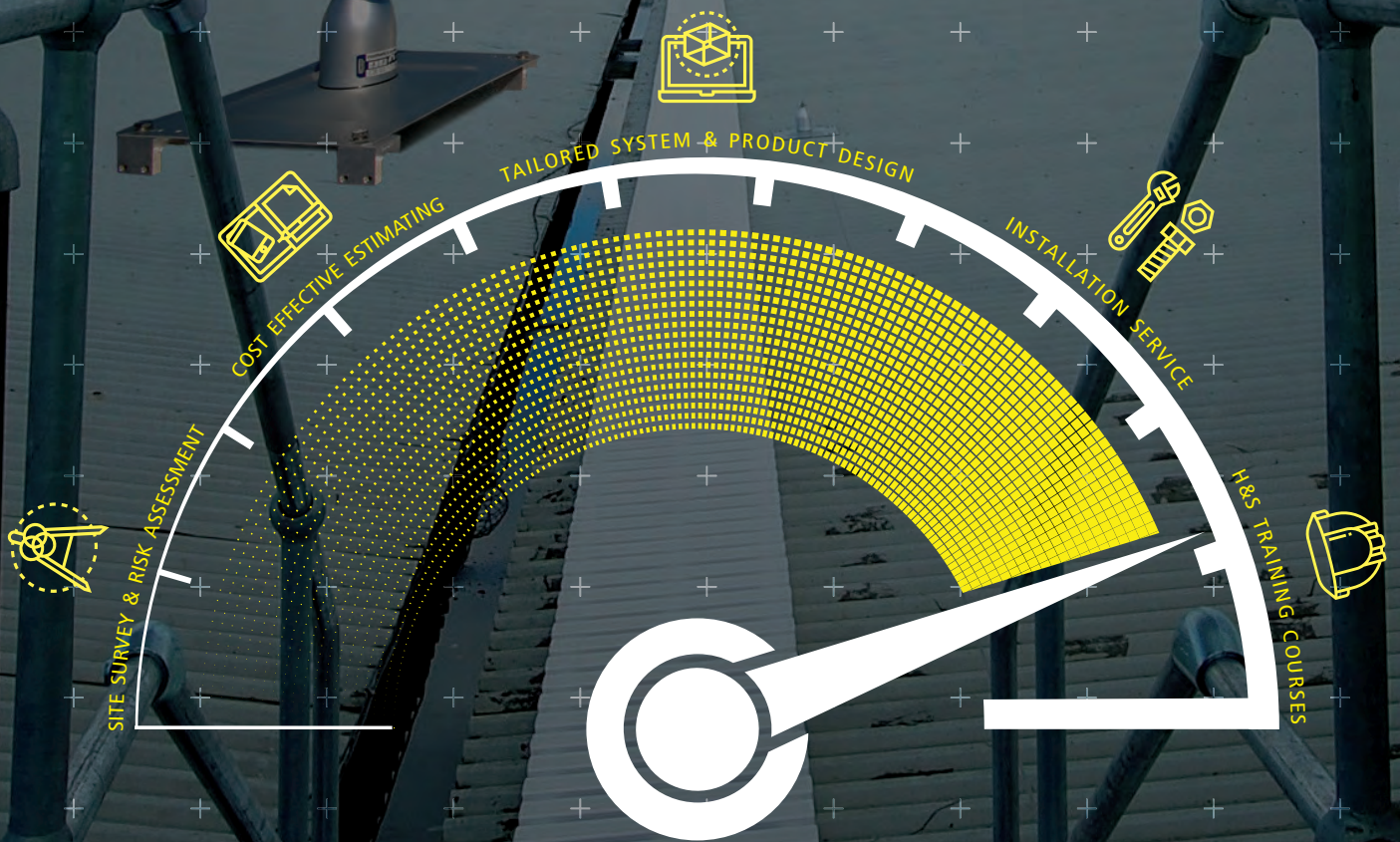
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# Making a difference

Increased membership, greater influence on safety issues and stronger industry relationships made 2016 a great year for NASC, says NASC president **Alan Lilley**, and the coming year looks set to herald even more success.

**A**s I enter my second year in office I am pleased to report the initiatives we undertook to attract new members have proved an unqualified success. In the past year we have received no less than 32 number applications for full contracting membership. This is a record since the audit procedure was introduced 10 years ago. At the time of writing, 13 of these have already been successful and joined as full members whilst 15 are still being processed, with high hopes that by the end of this year the number of new members could well be above 20 in number.

It is my intention to ensure that all new applications going forward will be assisted and mentored at every stage of the audit process to ensure they will have every opportunity to succeed.

I am eager for the NASC to be seen to represent the whole of the scaffold industry and therefore further initiatives by the Confederation are being planned to broaden its appeal particularly to the small and medium-sized enterprises. Now is an opportune time for all companies who are interested to apply for full contracting membership.

With the retirement of Peter Clarkson – northern regional auditor – a vacancy has arisen and therefore we will be looking for potential candidates to apply for the position. A full and extensive knowledge of the scaffold industry will be essential along with a track record of running a company in a senior management role.

The officers and directors of the NASC have re-drafted the articles of association to bring them into line with current company law. These will be circulated to all the members in good time so they can be voted on at the Annual General Meeting on 25 November 2016.

## Safety progress

Earlier in the year David Mosely (director of NASC Training and CISRS manager) and Ken Johnson (NASC health and safety and technical support) and I held a constructive meeting with the Health & Safety Executive in London to discuss how we could increase co-operation between our two organisations.

The confederation decided, as a result of this increased co-operation, to offer one full suite of TG20:13 free to all HSE

regional offices. I am pleased to confirm that the HSE took up our offer and now all its inspectors throughout the country have access to this vital document to refer to when inspecting scaffolds on construction sites.

At the core of the NASC's business is its range of publications it produces, in particular the safety and technical guidance notes. I would like to express my gratitude to all the standing committees for their hard work and dedication which goes into producing these excellent guides.

Last year SG4:15 was launched and has been well received by the industry and the Health and Safety Executive. TG20:13 continues to be embraced by the membership and clients alike and last year saw a free update issued to the e-guide to further enhance its capabilities to provide a simple but effective design solution for the more common yet numerous scaffolds erected on a daily basis throughout the country.

## TG20:13 rewrite

This coming year it is our intention to hold information/technical seminars on TG20:13. We will be inviting temporary works engineers from main contractors to attend to further increase awareness of this most important guide. All companies that are represented at these meetings will receive one free TG20:13 suite to aid them when involved with scaffold design. >



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## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

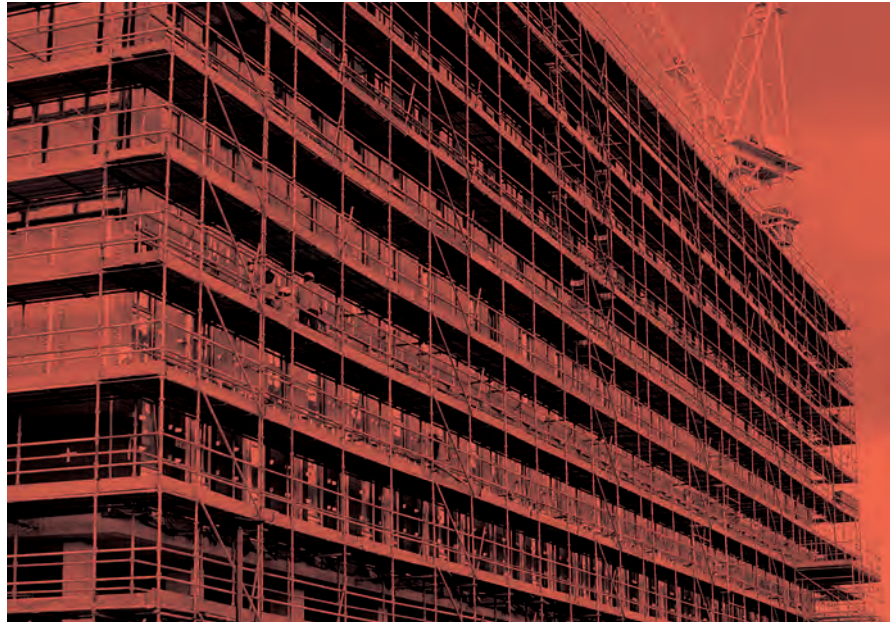
< We are now looking ahead to the re-write of this document and to this end a working party has been set up to consider what will be feasible to enhance its capabilities in preparation for its reissue.

The coming year will see the introduction of continuous professional development (CPD). This is long overdue and will go some way to providing independent formal training on the regulations and guidance introduced to the industry over the past decade.

CISRS will introduce a two-day course from June 2017 for all those who require to renew their CISRS card. The syllabus is designed to ensure that it will deliver value for money for both the employer and employee.

### Getting results

I am often asked does the NASC really make a difference? My answer to that is look at the Confederation's annual safety report statistics. Since the 1980s the number of NASC scaffolders has doubled from 8,000 to approximately 16,000 whilst the number of reportable accidents in the same period has seen an 80% reduction from 550 to below 100.



This is a long term reduction in our accident statistics and is a direct result of our members training their employees to a very high standard and implementing the guidance issued by the confederation. It also shows that the work of the NASC audit team is having a real effect in

ensuring the standards set by our organisation are met at all times by our members. ■

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# Competence and compliance

An increasing number of principal contractors are specifying NASC only companies because they understand it demonstrates their commitment to high standards and best practice. Here is all you need to know about NASC membership.

**T**he National Access and Scaffolding Confederation (NASC) has been the established national trade association for the scaffolding industry for nearly 70 years. Its mission statement is to ensure the scaffolding and access industry maintains the highest practicable standards of workmanship via cohesive development and detailed regulation.

## How does the NASC help the construction industry?

By providing regulated scaffolding companies who work to a strong audited procedure for compliance. By appointing an NASC member company you can be assured of a scaffolding company that is competent and abides by the latest working practices for scaffolding.

## The NASC at work

There are a number of organisations associated with the construction industry. The NASC is one of the largest with 220 full member companies accounting for over 70% of the UK's total spend on scaffolding. All NASC guidance and publications are in line with the latest developments in construction and building. The NASC consults regularly with the following organisations to strive for best practice in scaffolding:

- HSE (Health and Safety Executive)
- Build UK
- CISRS (Construction Industry Scaffolders Record Scheme)
- CSCS (Construction Skills Certification Scheme)
- CITB (Construction Industry Training Board)
- BSI (British Standards Institute)
- Strategic Forum for Construction
- APS (Association for Project Safety)

The NASC has elected Directors and Officers plus a members' Council which oversees all NASC activity, provides direction and makes strategic decisions. The Officers are elected by rotation and are drawn from the membership.

The Confederation is run on a day-to-day basis by permanent staff who are based mainly in London.

## How does a company become a member of the NASC?

Membership of the NASC is open to any company working in the scaffolding sector. However, acceptance is via a strict application process. Applicants are first required to complete (in full) a detailed application form. Failure to meet all the requirements will result in membership being denied.

Once the application form has been received and a desktop audit completed satisfactorily, independent auditors then inspect the applicant's office, yard and a number of sites to ensure that best practice is an everyday occurrence.

Upon verification that all parts of NASC criteria have been met, the application is recommended to NASC Council for ratification. Only after the company has paid its annual subscription fee is it issued with a certificate of NASC membership.

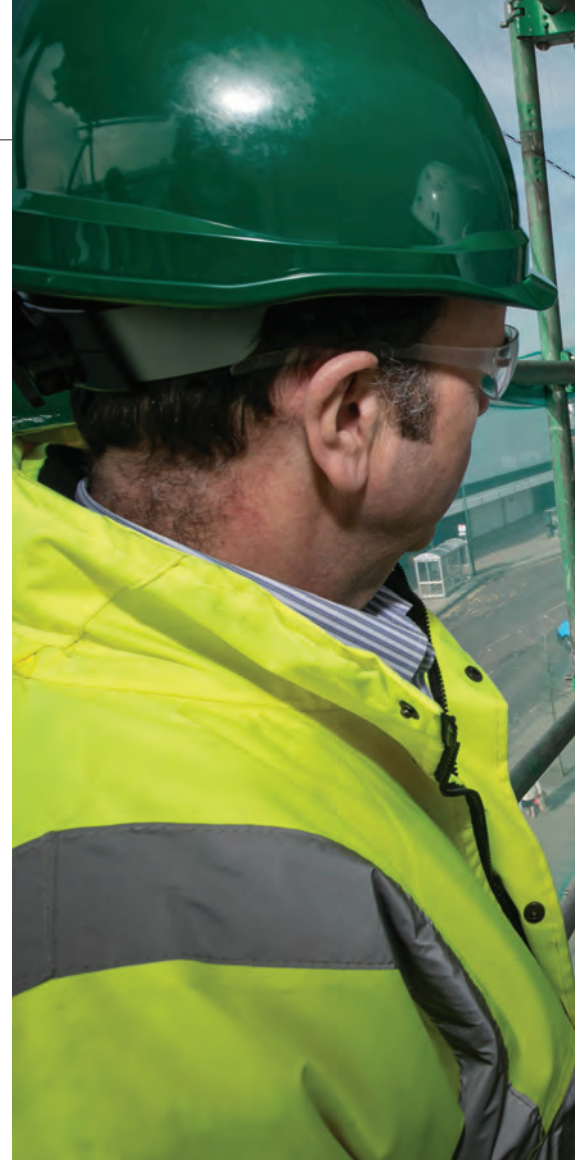
Members are then re-audited after an initial 12-month period to ensure continued compliance, followed by a biennial audit thereafter.

There are three categories of membership:

- Full membership: Companies which supply, erect and dismantle scaffolding with at least 75% directly employed trained labour.
- Full membership (non-contracting): Companies which supply scaffolding equipment via hire, sale or manufacturing.
- Information membership: Companies which provide a service to the scaffolding industry.

## Why should you use an NASC regulated company?

When you employ an NASC member to carry out work or supply equipment you are making an informed decision. You know what to expect, your expectations are met and, of course, ultimately you are making the right choice.

## Is the work of the NASC really making a difference?

Over the past three decades the number of NASC scaffolders in the UK has risen from approximately 8,000 in 1980 to 15,000 by the end of 2015.

Despite the rise in the number of scaffolders, the incidence rate for accidents has declined steadily. The number of reported accidents in 1980 was 532; by 2014 that figure had reduced to 96. The NASC will continue to strive towards its ultimate goal of zero accidents/incidents.

The NASC produces an annual safety report which is published to industry. All NASC full contracting members must contribute to this report with factual evidence. This report is available free upon request.

## WHAT CAN YOU EXPECT FROM AN NASC MEMBER?

**An NASC full member company must meet the following criteria:**

#### Trading for two years

A member company must provide copies of trading accounts for the previous two years as prepared by the company accountants/auditors. The company must also be VAT registered.

#### Directly employed operatives

A minimum of 75% of hourly paid operatives must be directly employed.

#### A high standard of trained personnel

All NASC members must have at least 90% of the scaffolding workforce registered with the CISRS (Construction Industry Scaffolders Record Scheme) and have the appropriate 50% level of fully-qualified operatives.

#### Adequate health and safety provision

Members must provide a satisfactory signed Health and Safety policy statement, provide evidence that they meet current health and safety legislation and agree to complete the NASC

annual accident return.

#### Working practice

All members must adhere to the latest guidance published by the NASC.

#### Insurance

An NASC member must hold a minimum of £5m public liability insurance, plus at least £10m employers liability cover.

#### Materials

NASC Hire, Sale and Manufacturing members must abide by a minimum standard that ensures materials conform to the NASC Code of Practice for scaffolding products.

#### Code of conduct

The NASC publishes a code of conduct which all members must abide by.

#### What happens if a member company doesn't conform?

In the first instance a member company is asked to take action to conform. If this is not actioned then termination of membership may follow. ■

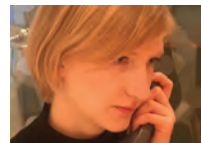

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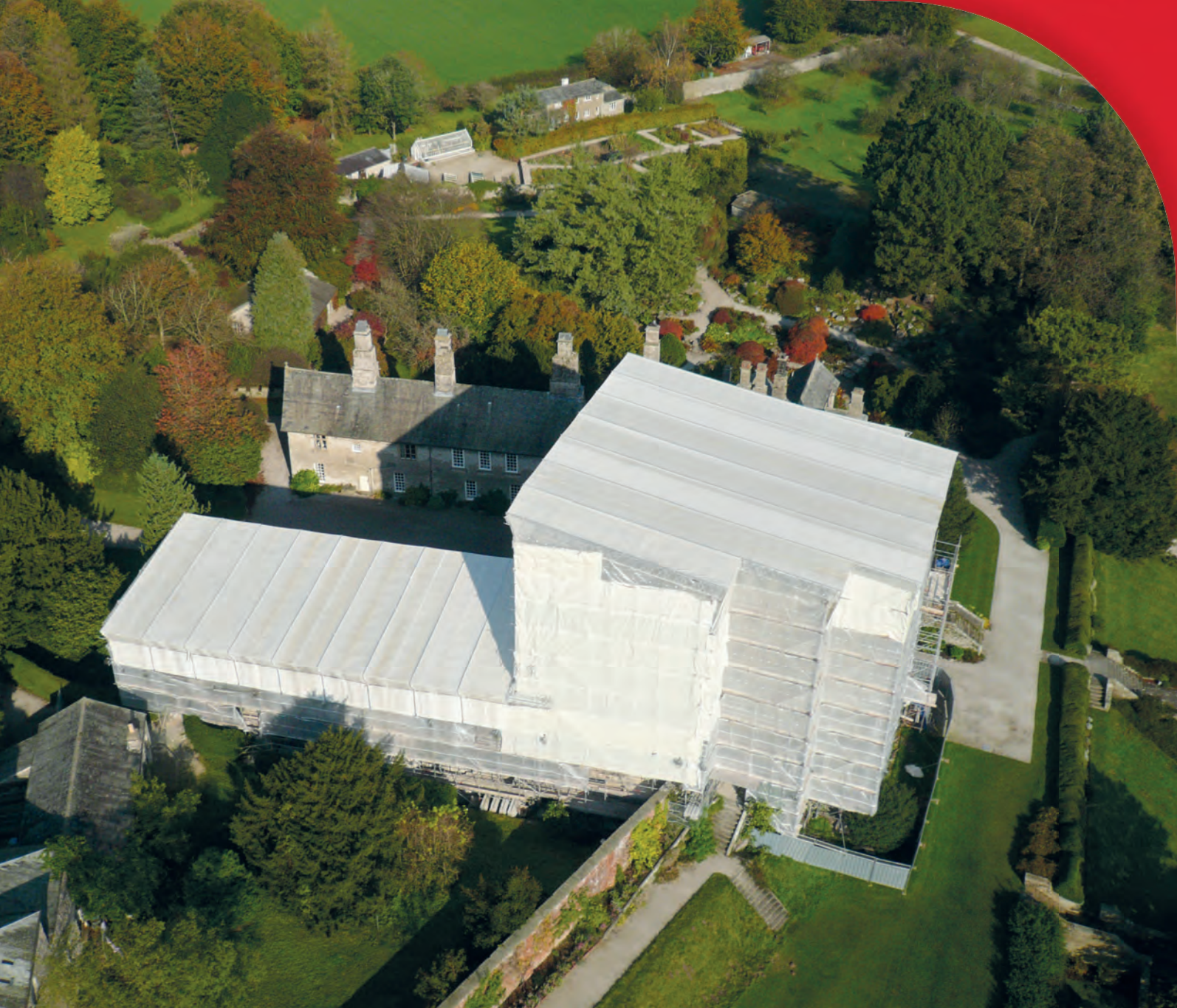
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# Record breakers

Unprecedented numbers of membership applications and an increase in the number of scaffold firms passing audit has made 2016 a great year for the NASC. **Alan Lilley** reports.

It has been another busy year in the continually evolving and important work of the NASC Audit Committee.

I have been NASC President for a year now and my main goal was to attract small-to medium size scaffolding companies to join the NASC. We reduced the subscription fee to £995 for scaffolding companies with a turnover of less than £1m to encourage companies to apply. Our team has definitely noticed a spike in membership enquiries. We have received 27 applications for membership over the past 12 months – a 45% increase on applications received over the previous period – and welcomed six new full members so far this year. With another eight applications due to undergo a site audit, we are on schedule for this to be a record-breaking year for new members.

We have always welcomed new applications. In fact, it has long been the wish of the NASC to have all scaffold companies in membership to help create a level playing field, a high standard of safety, and professionalism throughout the industry. The audit process is continually evolving but we remain strict with our criteria, so applicants must demonstrate compliance with all parts of the NASC criteria for their application to succeed. We recognise that we could have done more to assist companies who previously applied for membership. We do understand that the completion of the paperwork isn't an easy task, especially for the smaller sized companies, and so we will in future play more of a tutorial role in the application process.

## Timescale review

We have also reviewed the 12-month re-application timescale that is given to applicants who do not meet the criteria. Our auditors are now able to recommend a timescale for the necessary improvements to be made before a reapplication can be submitted. This could be as little as three months and a report will highlight the areas of non-compliance giving the applicant the best possible chance for their re-application to be successful.

The NASC has recently designed a new-look membership certificate as it was felt that the old design did not reflect the achievement and importance of what it takes to pass such a demanding audit. I think members will be proud to show this new certificate to their customers and clients.

We are over halfway through our existing member audit programme and we are happy to report an all-time low on non-compliance issues identified. We take the same action against existing members as we do against prospective members who are not fully compliant with the criteria.

One of our auditors, Peter Clarkson, is retiring at the end of the audit programme in May 2017. The committee is losing a highly experienced and valued member. Peter has been involved in audits for a number of years as chair of the NASC Northern & North Wales region before joining as an auditor in 2010.

On behalf of the directors, officers and members of the NASC I would like to record my thanks to Peter for his input and commitment to the work of the Confederation.

We will be looking to find a replacement for Peter to carry out audits in the Northern & North Wales region and would like anyone with contract scaffolding and audit experience to apply to the NASC.

## Stepping down

I have been the chair of the Audit Committee since its formation in 2008 but it is now time for me to step down. I am immensely proud of the work that the committee has carried out under my leadership and Jamie McGuire's management but it is time for someone else to take over the reins and bring new, fresh ideas and enthusiasm to this most important of roles.

I would like to thank the members of the committee for their hard work, dedication and loyalty whilst I have been chair and wish them all the success for the future under the stewardship of the new chair Mel Archer. ■

# Forward motion

Progress in various areas of training has continued in 2016 and next year looks set to see more development, including the introduction of a CPD scheme for CISRS card holders and the Apprentice Trailblazer programme. **Mike Burr** reports.

This year has seen the ASITO continue with the great work that the previous chair, the training manager and the committee had previously begun.

We have seen the committee continue with long term targets and initiatives including course standardisation, apprenticeship growth including the Apprentice of the Year Awards, additional funding for NASC members and a general increase in CISRS training, which is reflected in the increased numbers of registered CISRS cardholders.

In addition, the committee has continued to support an increase in interaction with schools and colleges, an increase in PR of the industry through social media and advertisements, and progression of the instructors' conferences.

There are plenty of fresh challenges for the forthcoming year with the introduction of the new CPD course for scaffolders seeking to renew their CISRS cards; the introduction of the Trailblazers Apprentice scheme; and encouraging new blood into the scaffolding industry to fulfil the skills shortages a lot of companies within the sector are facing.

## Course Standardisation

The CISRS Standardisation programme continues in earnest. The CISRS Part 2 course documents (PowerPoint, drawings, lesson plans, test papers and supporting literature) were issued to training providers in June 2016 and are now being used by all accredited centres. The working party responds to comments and suggestions made by the providers and they will collate these and make revisions to the package where it is deemed appropriate.

A revised and updated edition of the Basic Scaffold Inspection course has also been issued to centres in 2016.

Work is ongoing with the Advanced course which should be fully operational by the early part of 2017. The CISRS Supervisors course will then follow. Completion of this project will ensure that there is uniformity of training throughout the accredited centres.

## Funding

The committee again managed to obtain funding to run Systems Scaffold Product Training Scheme courses (SSPTS) across all NASC regions. In the absence of

funding being available from CITB, NASC set aside £30,000 in order to run its own Qualifying the Workforce programme which has proved to be very successful. The committee will continue to look for additional sources of funding that can be used to support those companies who commit to training their staff.

## Instructors Conference

The third instructors' conference was held in September at the CITB in Bircham Newton. The introduction of these conferences has proved a very worthwhile

exercise and it gives the instructors a chance to share their experiences, vent their frustrations and discuss changes that are being implemented in the centres.

The conference included a presentation on Temporary Works which is becoming a hot topic with several items crossing over from a more formwork type sector into mainstream scaffolding.

## CISRS Cards

There are approximately 60,000 current CISRS cardholders at the time of writing with around half of those made up of Scaffolder (19,500) and Advanced cards (10,500). There are approximately 8,000 registered operatives in both the Labourer and Trainee cardholder category with the remainder being made up by Inspection and Supervisors.

We now have over 6,000 scaffolders who have completed additional systems scaffold training and have had their cards endorsed accordingly and these figures are showing growth each year.

In 2000 there were only around 20,000 CISRS cardholders on the database: the trebling in numbers indicates the rise in formal training being carried out and the high value that the industry puts on CISRS qualifications

## CPD for Scaffolders

The date has now been set: June 2017 will see the introduction of the new CPD programme.

The CISRS scheme has been under long term pressure from the HSE to introduce a requirement for CPD prior to the renewal of scaffolders cards. It is considered unacceptable, outside the scaffolding industry, for a safety critical trade to issue a new card every five years with the only criteria being that card holders have to pass a general health and safety test.

A two-day course is being developed which is expected to incorporate a health and safety test, a scaffold inspection module and an aluminium tower element which will be endorsed on the rear of the card.

This will save several days of separate/ third party training in addition to providing the comfort that clients/regulating bodies require that all card holders have received

◀ formal, up-to-date training in addition to falling in line with other specialised trades.

### Trailblazers for apprenticeships

Work continues with the development of the Scaffolding Apprentice Trailblazer programme. Our 'expression of interest' was accepted by BIS in January 2016. The group agreed to work along similar lines as our existing apprentice framework model/format but would look to make a few improvements adding additional value for both the apprentice and employer.

There is a fairly long journey to take before we have an approved scheme in place which matches the new requirements but protects our existing scheme.

The group does have concerns in relation to employers' up front contribution requirement which many consider will result in a decline in the number of employers using the Apprenticeship route to CISRS qualification.

### Bright Future

It is my opinion that the scaffold industry continues to make great strides in its professional approach which is improving



the way it is thought of by other sectors within the construction industry.

It is ASITO's intention and remit to ensure that safe working methods and industry best practice are engrained within the CISRS scheme and it will

strive to improve the quality of training year on year. ■

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# Committed to safety

The Health & Safety Committee has continued its productivity and awareness of effective guidance. **Adrian Rooney** reports on how it continues to work hard to ensure the safety of scaffolders and their working environment.

**T**he NASC Health and Safety Committee is made up from industry professionals dedicated to bringing members the required guidance and advice to ensure that our workers and workplaces become safer.

With the support of the NASC Council we have been able to add new initiatives that reach out directly to major contractors to emphasise their responsibilities in ensuring that scaffolds are constructed consistently to the same standards, guidance and controls. We have been able to demonstrate that the correct way to work safely is within our Safety Guidance. I consider this a vital role to eliminate a two-tier standard on how work is currently conducted in our industry. We welcome management controls in scaffolding/temporary works and work hard to ensure that our standards are adopted and applied to all scaffolding work. We have also reached out to the SME sector and hope to continue that work to ensure all operatives go home safely.

## Guidance updates

The Safety Guidance notes continue to form best practice for our industry and by targeting the industry as a whole it allows us to give the best guidance and advice to enable everyone to conform to the legislation that ultimately establishes the responsibilities.

This year has seen the completion of guidance on Asbestos, COSHH, Preventing Falls, Manual Handling, RIDDOR, Drugs and Alcohol, Health Surveillance, Rescue Plan, Confined Spaces, Induction Training, Timber Frame Buildings, Internal Edge Protection, Working from Vehicles, and Protection of the Public.

## SG4:15 Preventing Falls in scaffolding.

The NASC core document on safe working is often quoted but still needs to become practice in the whole industry. It is the first time that we have offered guidance free to all and we have enjoyed the support of the HSE in this particular process as well as it being a highly-valued member of the Committee with solid guidance and support.

This guidance makes it easy to assess how a scaffolder is functioning in his responsibility in complying to SG4:15 and if he is not then there can be no place for him on site.

## Industry representation

The Health & Safety Committee has representatives on various industry organisations including HSE-led initiatives, the Asbestos Liaison Group, CONIAC, UKCG, NEBOSH and Build UK. The H&S Committee also works closely and actively with CISRS and all training bodies within the industry.

The *NASC Annual Safety Report* sets out our aims and what the industry can expect from NASC members and also documents comparisons in accident statistics, injuries to operatives, causes of accidents, analysis of accidents and injuries to third parties and members of the public.

We can report that again there were no

fatalities in this year but we still recognise the dangers faced to our trade and all operatives on site. We must endeavour to ensure that this becomes the norm as it has been now for a number of years. Our aim is always to ensure that safe working procedures cover every known aspect of our work, regulations and all legislation, ensuring our place is maintained at the forefront in making our workplace safer.

It is also intended that we will monitor and consider associated guidance from other sources that may impact on safe working in our field to ensure that any conflicting advice does not lead to bad practice or confusion or looking at how other guidances can improve the way we lead.

While there are still many obstacles to get over I look forward to the year ahead to strengthen the work that has been done to date and to demonstrate that the NASC remains the driving force for improving health and safety in the scaffolding industry. ■

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# Working out

Closer working with the Health & Safety Executive, a review of TG20 and the issue of new guidance are just some examples of the work of the Technical Committee in 2016. **James Attridge** reports.

The Committee is made up of volunteers who give their time to consider all matters technical for the benefit of the members. In addition to this we are joined by The Health and Safety Executive (HSE) representation of Paul Thomas who gives us much appreciated assistance and expertise.

The team works well and the chair has encouraged more dialogue and debate at the meetings during the reviews of guidance notes. Each new guidance note is initially reviewed or drafted by a sub-committee. Existing guidance notes are reviewed at least every five years (unless there is a change in legislation or procedures that affects a particular guidance note). The first draft is then reviewed by the full committee before being sent through to the Council for final approval.

A closer working relationship with the HSE has been established and this has resulted in a joint sub-committee being set up to develop a guidance note on Edge Protection. During its initial stages it has become apparent that the HSE was developing a group to resolve the issues of edge protection. Therefore the joint sub-committee is now representing the NASC in this group under the lead of Ray Cooke of HSE. Work is ongoing.

## TG20 news

The implementation of TG20:13, particularly the eguide, continues to grow. The TG20 compliance sheet has now become a standard part of the scaffolding procedure. This has cleared up any confusion about design. If a TG20 compliance sheet cannot be produced, then the scaffold requires a design. The next review of TG20 is already under way. All users of TG20:13 have had the opportunity so submit comments and a wish list for items that they would like to be included in the new review. The TG20 working group would like to extend its thanks to the respondents for submitting detailed and helpful feedback. These responses have been consolidated and are currently being reviewed.

## Standards committees

The NASC continues to be represented in all BSI committees relative to scaffolding. We are also represented in Europe where we strengthen our ties to ensure that we are in touch with change. Working group WG15 is writing a new Standard in regard to the manufacture of prefabricated products. This should be issued early in 2017.



The Technical Committee is constantly reviewing guidance

Working Group 4 is also resurrected and will continue its review of Aluminium Towers to ensure that EN1004 complies with the revision of BS1139-6. Further consideration in regard to a standard for suspended access is also being considered.

New/updated guidance is now available on rubbish chutes; anchorage systems; care and maintenance of scaffold boards; design and construction of temporary roofs; tying down of scaffold boards; and non-standard boarded platforms. The group is constantly reviewing existing guidance and writing new guidance when requested by members to do so. A new guidance note on fittings not covered under EN74 is currently being developed.

## Member input

Member input, your feedback and involvement is essential to stretching the group to perform at its best. We welcome enquiries from members in regard to technical issues that need addressing. If you consider further guidance is beneficial then we will bring it to the group. It is your committee and here to serve.

We would again express our thanks for the work of all committee members who have served over the years in the development of TG20 and other guidance. Membership of the committee is well balanced and should give longevity. We have endeavoured to ensure technical representation is maintained at regional meetings. The group now has 18 members with people waiting to join. It is a long term commitment and has practical limits on size, though we do realise that there is potential among the membership to see continued input. We do not anticipate change in its structure in the near future but still welcome applications that will be kept on a waiting list. ■

## Audits & plaudits

**Des Moore** reports on a strong year for the committee and looks forward to the inaugural NASC award for scaffold product innovation

The committee has continued to grow from strength to strength. Over the past 12 months the group has welcomed representatives from two new member companies: St Helens Plant and Brisko Scaffolding Ltd, meaning that it continues to meet its objective to be fully representative of the UK industry hire/sales sector. Two further applications have been received in 2016 and are currently being addressed.

The driver for membership of the group remains the NASC Code of Practice for scaffolding products, and its associated product audit process. Audits are increasingly carried out at point of manufacture worldwide, with an associated quality audit at member company head offices in the UK. The audit is widely regarded as a benchmark for UK-based scaffolding companies servicing the hire/sales product needs of the industry, and remains a core agenda item for discussions at meetings of the NASC Hire/Sales Committee.

There were no additions to the suite of products currently covered by the NASC Code of Practice in 2016. However it is envisaged

that TG20:13 compliant readylock transoms will be incorporated in 2017. Following publication of revised test criteria by CADS during 2016, member representatives on the committee have been instrumental in developing a test process to ensure that suppliers are able to confirm compliance. This process is now up and running and available to UK suppliers and contractors.

The committee has developed a biennial NASC award for product innovation. The purpose of the award is to celebrate the very best developments in new scaffolding materials and products from leading industry suppliers. Entries from NASC member companies are being accepted for any widely-used scaffolding material, or access and scaffolding product. The inaugural award will be given to the most worthy recipient in the opinion of the judges at the NASC AGM in Amsterdam on 25 November 2016. ■

### NASC Code of Practice product audit

The NASC Code of Practice audit programme was introduced in 2010 for System Scaffold products after a two-year development period. Since that time the programme has been advanced to include Aluminium Beams, EN74-1 Couplers, EN39 & EN10219 High Tensile Tube and BS2482 Timber Boards. The programme is currently being further developed with the inclusion of TG20:13 compliant Pre-fabricated Unit Transoms scheduled for 2017.

The rationale behind the Code of Practice audit was to introduce a level of compliance that NASC members should adhere to, with the audit covering quality management, product testing and raw material and component control. In 2016 the requirement for mandatory site visits was implemented for system scaffold products with a significant number of audit questions added in relation to product and process control, with a particular emphasis on welding activities. Where applicable relevant BS, EN, DIN & ISO Standards are utilised. 2017 will see a similar requirement in relation to mandatory site visits for aluminium beams.

Compliant products are listed on the NASC website.

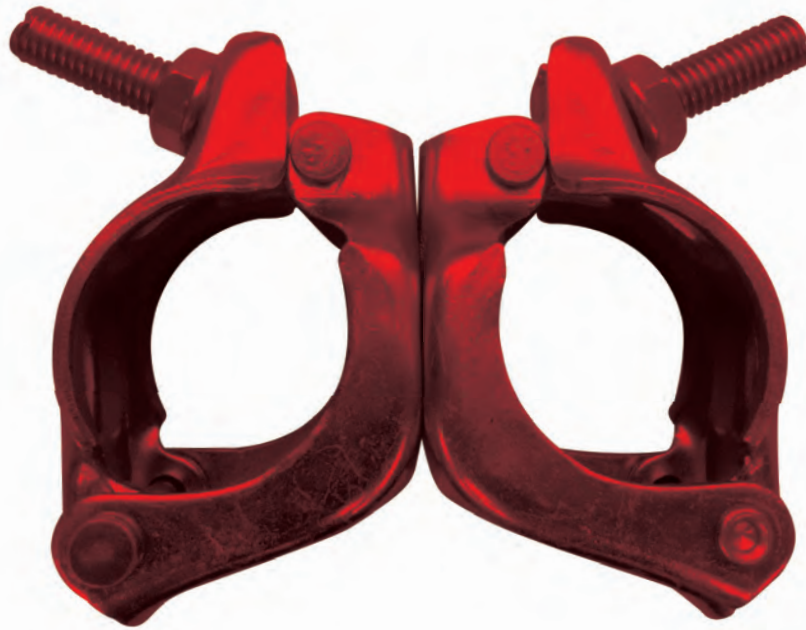

# New broom

New and revised guidance notes, an expanding committee and a new chair are all part of the latest developments on the NASC Contracts Committee. **David Brown** reports.

**A**s the new chair, on behalf of the committee I would like to pay tribute to Trevor Clarke for his excellent guidance and leadership over the past two years. Trevor has overseen a step change in the committee workload, which has already begun to generate a tranche of new and revised NASC contractual guidance.

I have attended meetings of the UK Contractors Legal Group on behalf of the Confederation in recent years and intend to bring that experience to bear at meetings of the NASC Contracts Committee going forward.

Perhaps the most pleasing item to report is that the group has finalised a number of guidance notes for issue in 2016, further to review. These include CG7:16 Late Payment of Commercial Debt, CG9:16 Payment under the Construction Act, CG10:16 Adjudication – its Use by the Subcontractor, and CG11:16 Preparation of Schedules of Rates.

The group has since finalised a further tranche of revised contractual guidance. This will shortly be circulated to NASC Council for approval prior to publication. Waiting in the wings are several proposed new guidance items. These include Early Payment Terms, Credit Control, and Eligibility for Employment. All will be finalised for issue during 2017.

### Clarification

The next project for the committee will be to issue guidance on 'ambiguous clauses' in contractual documents. Terms such as 'Lump Sum' and 'Fixed Price' may appear straightforward, however this is not always the case! Using social media, the committee will be seeking feedback from member companies in regard to their experience of the application of apparently straightforward terms by principal contractors. The intention here will be to keep member companies on their toes to ensure they are not tripped up by the detail in contractual agreements.

The committee would again like to express its gratitude to Liz Bridge (Joint Taxation Committee) for her involvement. Liz produces a monthly bulletin (JTC Newsline) on tax-related matters which is full of helpful information for NASC contracting members. Copies of the bulletin are posted on the NASC website members area, under tax.

Finally it is gratifying to be able to report that this small but dedicated committee has been augmented in 2016 by the arrival of two additional members from the South West. We extend a warm welcome to Matthew Cousins (Apex Scaffolding (Exeter) Ltd) and Dave Battison (Fred Champion Scaffolding Ltd) and we look forward to benefiting from the fresh input which they are already bringing to committee discussions. ■

# Promoting partnership

**Gray Rigge** introduces the Construction Industry Joint Council and explains its role in fostering good industrial relationships in the construction industry

The Construction Industry Joint Council (CIJC) is a formal partnership between employers and trade unions. The industrial partners are nine trade associations (of which the NASC is one) and three trade unions.

The partnership administers and reviews the Working Rule Agreement for the Construction Industry, (sometimes known as the Pink Book or WRA), which is the largest industrial agreement in the construction industry and used as a reference for over 500,000 workers. The WRA sets out minimum rates of pay and promotes best employment practice across the industry.

The CIJC meets regularly with the aim of promoting positive working relationships within the industry, improvements in safety, quality and efficiency. ■

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# Scaffold solution helps return iconic landmark to London skyline

## PROJECT:

In the past year Battersea Power Station has been recognised in multiple awards including best new office space in the unbuilt office category.

As part of the transformation, Grade II\* listed Battersea Power Station will create over 100,000m<sup>2</sup> of office space over six floors within the converted Boiler House.

In the heart of the space will be one of the world's largest atria. At six-storeys high it will filter light to all office areas whilst allowing views of the chimneys above.

The south-west chimney is fully rebuilt, and the new north and south-east chimneys are quickly re-emerging, allowing a much-loved silhouette to return to London's skyline.

The Power Station, which sits at the heart of the 42-acre development, will open to the public in 2020, coinciding with the opening of a new Northern Line tube station.

With numerous access scaffolds required to the main façades of the Power Station, QFS Scaffolding Ltd is committed to safeguarding the distinctive profiles for the enjoyment of future generations, by ensuring minimal intrusion into the Power Station's delicate fabric.

QFS has maintained a very close relationship with Skanska

LSE and Battersea Power Station Development Corporation and worked collaboratively with each team to deliver a detailed design schedule for each of the required access solutions.

### Climbing wall

One of the most challenging elements of work has been to design and build a support scaffold to transfer the weight of the east wall birdcage erected within the Boiler House.

The design needed to span back to the main supporting foundations of the façade retention to allow excavations to take place, both internally and externally of the façade scheme.

The birdcage scaffold was provided to access one of the

largest temporary retention schemes in Europe which has helped to preserve the prestigious façade for over 25 years. The scaffold birdcage is in excess of 120,000m<sup>3</sup> and stands at 52 metres high. It was designed to cater for the demolition of the main east wall along with the retention scheme, making way for the rebuild.

### Make way for demolition

QFS was asked to develop and design a solution that could not only provide access to the retention scheme, which changed layout on every lift, but also build a four-metre wide, 150 metre length, scaffold that could support two Brokk demolition machines along the full internal façade of the east wall. This would allow the Brokks to carry out demolition efficiently on an unrestricted platform.

The supporting structure required for one of the biggest birdcages erected in the UK, needed to span 12.5 metres to sit comfortably on each of the foundations. The structure consisted of four lines of twin 1.3m Dessa HD beams, spaced

at five metres providing the base support with twin 750mm Apollo X Beams, picking up each of the 75 birdcage leg lines. The foundation supports stopped short of the four internal leg lines, meaning that QFS had to overcome the possible undermining of these legs caused by the planned excavations.

The solution lay in one of the supporting Turbine Hall roof steels, which stood at nearly two meters in height and ran the full length of the Boiler House. QFS designed and built the inside four legs to bridge across at the roof beam level, effectively producing a support to the scaffold below. This also provided additional support to the Brokk line that needed to cater for the dynamic loads produced when the Brokks were in use.

Anthony Noble, QFS contracts director, explained that months of careful pre-planning and design has helped to deliver a scheme that not only helps the trades working on the scaffold, but also takes into account the works around the Power Station's Boiler House below.

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## Confined city centre location caused challenges

Bryson Scaffolding Ltd was appointed by Morgan Lovell PLC to provide scaffold to contribute to the category A refurbishment of Capital House into offices.

The development is set within a busy location in the centre of Bristol opposite the newly-developed Cabot Circus Shopping Centre.

Bryson commenced scaffolding works on this project in January 2016 progressively with dismantling at various stages leading to August 2016.

Much consideration was given to the heavily pedestrian and vehicular trafficked area. Additional constraints such as confined areas and the vast number of trades from early stages in the project contributed to limited storage space for scaffolding equipment.

The construction programme dictated that elevation scaffolds

to all elevations be erected in full including hoist scaffolding and hoist. The client's main issue was for the scaffolding to provide a weather-proof canopy at top floor level to enable part of the roof structure to be removed, adjusted and reinstated to a different position to provide balcony areas

to new rooms at high level.

To maintain access into the building and across low level structures, beam work of varying sizes to a number of locations was carried out. Careful management and consideration was given to the scaffolding works and specifically during

the preparation, erection and dismantling of scaffolding to the front elevation. This area contained a bus stop and heavy foot trafficked area which had to remain live for the duration of the works.

The central area of the building contained a large atrium area. Scaffolding was required to provide a working lift at all levels to enable the full replacement of curtain walling to occur. As part of these works, due to the atrium area commencing at first floor level, the car park area beneath was propped and suitably segregated enabling both the weight of the scaffolding above to be transferred and the car park area to remain live.

Bryson Scaffolding overcame the constraints and the project was successfully completed and handed over to the client.

## Cathedral conservation requires careful access

Wood Group Industrial Services (WGIS) is providing scaffold and alternative access services to allow conservation and repair works to the iconic Durham Cathedral.

The Cathedral was founded in 1093 and is regarded as one of the finest examples of Norman architecture within the UK and has been designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

The project involves dismantling the failing parapet stone work to the top of the belfry tower to allow conservation and repairs of the stone work to take place including the installation of new stone work and internal re-enforcement.

The project required WGIS to provide the highest quality scaffold design to take into

consideration the intricate features of the building, its age and grade listing, ensuring a safe and clear passage to the masonry areas and conservation works.

The firm provided a tube and fitting scaffold loading gantry complete with 1,500kg hoist up to the nave level, to provide access for operatives and for the removal

and installation of heavy stone work up to 500kg per item.

From the loading gantry an 800kg single mast hoist was used up to the top of the tower which stands at 70m high. A tube and fitting independent birdcage scaffold was erected with a running track to aid the removal and installation of the heavy stone work, carrying loads up to one tonne. And 750mm deep aluminium beams were installed, designed to protrude over the edge of the belfry tower on all four sides. The scaffold structure was dropped down 16m to provide eight fully boarded scaffold lifts which were completely encased in Enviwrap sheeting to provide full containment from the weather during the repair works.





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# TRAD shows its head for heights in tricky top storey city centre task

TRAD has recently erected a high profile project in Bristol using the new Plettac Metrix System, within programme and without incident.

Fit out specialist and main contractor ISG was briefed by its client with the complex task of constructing a new one storey extension on top of an existing 15-storey office premises at Redcliff Street in Bristol, the working level of which was 65m high with all floors below remaining in full occupation whilst the works were carried out.

Given the extremely high risk in carrying out the scaffolding works, ISG approached TRAD to discuss various scaffolding schemes for giving safe access for the main contractor and their sub-contractors.

## Tried and tested

TRAD has vast experience of safely carrying out this type of project: TRAD and ISG have previously worked together on many difficult projects, including the BT Tower and Bush House in central London,

both of which were potentially hazardous to the public, with operational difficulties that needed to be overcome and very narrow programmes that needed to be met.

The Redcliff building is set in the middle of Bristol's city centre, flanked by a court house and local nursery to 50% of its elevations, thus requiring stringent control measures to eliminate the risk of falling materials.

TRAD planned the work in depth and a very detailed risk assessment/method statement, with pictorial sequential sketches, was produced for the erection of a high level cantilevered scaffold in the new Plettac Metrix System (which has been recently adopted by

TRAD to complement its tube and fitting scaffold). Selected sections were erected at night to further negate the risks.

This Plettac Metrix System allows for the cantilever sections to be safely erected from inside the building and raised into position – with tethered decks subsequently pushed out one by one on the cantilevered levels – thus creating a safe, fully-decked platform for the scaffolder to work from when erecting the next scaffolding level.

Given that the longest length of Metrix equipment was only 3m, risks of manual handling, work at height, and wind dislodgement were also negated. Using the Metrix System also eliminated the requirement for scaffold fittings which are notoriously difficult and time consuming to tether on overhead projects of this type.

## Ticking clock

Whilst safety was the primary requirement in erecting the scaffold, a high degree of attention was also placed on the schedule. With an ISG required 16-week programme for the erection of scaffolding, TRAD completed the 160m girth cantilever and the 6m-high independent raised from the cantilever in an exemplary eight weeks.

This was largely thanks to TRAD's operations manager Wayne Booth and his site team's diligent approach to sequencing the logistics and operations whilst working outside normal working hours. This time saving would not have been possible without the decision to opt for the Metrix System over traditional tube and fitting for this specific project.

TRAD is now planning ahead for the forthcoming dismantle to ensure that it will be carried out as efficiently and as safely as the erection process.

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# Bridge of size: bespoke system allows station upgrade to go full speed ahead

**X**ERVON Palmers is providing innovative scaffolding, public protection decks and access solutions for Galliford Try at the historic Carlisle Railway Station in Cumbria.

Works began at the Grade II listed building (which forms part of the Carlisle conservation zone) in January 2016 with completion expected by the end of the year. Leading principal contractor Galliford Try aims to refurbish the train-shed roof, maintain the station and extend the property's life by at least 30 years.

The in-house designed XERVON Palmers scaffold is required to provide access and protection decks and is 47m in span and 160m long, spanning 13 roof bays and the platforms below to create a working level 9m above ground level. It has been created by more than 20 advanced scaffolders, with additional support by XERVON Palmers management and supervisors.

And the modern access solutions will enable the historic roof to be refurbished, including glass removal and reconstruction together with steel repairs where necessary.

### Bespoke bracing

The state-of-the-art scaffolding supplied by XERVON Palmers is based on modular access and protection scaffold systems bespoke to the firm. The key component within the scaffold structure is 'Palmer's 1350 Bridge Panel System' – which incorporates bracing and end panels, so the components can be used in either beam structures to span the railway or support columns to provide bases for the protection decks.

The use of the Palmers bridging panel system is a key factor in allowing XERVON Palmers to design a scaffolding structure which can span the railway lines. This system crucially allows the works to carry on without interfering with the running of the railway – as well as protecting the commuting passengers and railway staff who operate within the station 365 days a year, where there are in excess of one million passenger movements through the station each year.

### Night shift

In addition, all scaffolding works over the tracks' electrified OLE System have to be erected during night-time possessions, which restrict the working time to a short five hour window, starting around midnight.

The XERVON Palmers design and construction team developed a scaffolding structure and solution that could be partially erected away from the main rail line to help minimise the risk of working at height and improve productivity

by carrying out works away from the railway environment outside the short night time possession windows.

Director Lindsay Harle said: "XERVON Palmers has been the scaffolding contractor of choice on some of the most significant railway station refurbishments in the UK – from St Pancras in London to Waverley Station in Edinburgh. And we are delighted to have been given the opportunity to support Galliford Try in the contract at Carlisle and look forward to a successful completion of this contract and working together successfully on many more projects thereafter."

Complete with valance sheeting will be erected so that they can take off the existing roof, clean it and re-roof at a higher level. The internal scaffold

is predominately made up of multi-level birdcages to enable to take the glass roof off.

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## Arched scaffold takes centre stage at festival

The Creamfields Steel Yard in Cheshire – created for the world-renowned Electronic Dance Music Event – was a spectacular structure: standing 50 metres wide by 90 metres in length and 20 metres high.

“Our client required a structure that would be functional – containing one of the principal performance areas at the event – and that would increase visual impact,” said Andy Nutter, managing director at Acorn Scaffolding, whose dedicated Acorn Events division undertook the work. “We worked closely with our customer LarMac LIVE to meet the need for a tailored structural staging system that delivered a unique experience to the audience. From initial pitch to completion, we focused on both the overall installation and also on the importance of the fine details, with a willingness to accommodate last minute

changes. The design of the structure, and the components used, played a key role in each case.”

The structure was built using HD Beams that were developed and engineered by Acorn and manufactured by Layher. With 100 tonne production load

bearing capacity, the beams not only enabled the structure’s dramatic arched shape to be erected, but were also able to carry rigging for sound, lighting and video – matching the scale of an event that is recognised as a truly international production. “The suitability of the system’s

design for a project of this type was enhanced by our ability to handle adverse weather conditions that were faced by our installation crew,” continued Nutter. “Their dedication ensured the simplicity of the connection method that is central to the beam design delivered completion within the one week time scale.”

Acorn has provided staging and ancillary structures at this event over the past couple of years, but this is the first time the company has used this modular temporary structure at this venue and its sheer scale pays testimony to the importance of the event and the ability of the design to meet a range of clear objectives.

“It created a facility of which we are extremely proud and with which, more importantly, the customer was delighted,” concluded Nutter.

## Track crossing challenge tackled with ease

A track crossing – both for pedestrians and key services – has been at the heart of a major footbridge installation undertaken by TR Scaffolding near Bristol.

Part of the rail development and electrification programme in the area, the project has not only fulfilled the need for access but has also been achieved with the minimum of line possessions.

Vehicular traffic was temporarily diverted during its demolition and reconstruction, but foot traffic as well as gas, electricity and communications connections still needed to cross the line at the same location.

TR Scaffolding utilised the Layher bridging system installed

in two sections spanning six and 14 metres. Supported by a central tower, the span provides both a wide public walkway while also accommodating the service

connections via two external cantilevered scaffolds. “This design has enabled everything to be contained in the one structure,” says TR Scaffolding

managing director, Stuart Salmon.

Two 1:12 ramps either side of the footbridge – which minimised the need for foundation work that would have been required with stairs – provide access to the footbridge which was installed to provide 6.2 metre clearance above the line.

The installation also needed to be adaptable. “The bridging design can accommodate loading that will allow the central support to be removed if required by the work on the tracks,” adds Salmon.

A build at ground level in two spans that were craned into position overnight, also ensured that the line possessions were minimised.



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## Ideal helps restore fire-ruined mansion house

In April 2015, a fire broke out at Clandon Park, a Palladian mansion built in the 1720s.

The fire spread from the basement through the lift shaft and into the roof damaging 95 per cent of the house and leaving it a shell. As a National Trust property, salvage and restoration is the primary aim which meant that the contents of the house had to be protected from the weather while the restoration works took place.

Ideal Scaffolding (Southern) Ltd was awarded the contract to erect a free-standing structure around the complete perimeter of the house with a Duo Pitch Temporary Roof using 32 miles of scaffold tube, 1600 metres of beam work, 45,000 fittings, 8,500 bungees, 4,500 flame retardant boards, 3,600 square metres of monarflex and 395 tonnes of kentledge.

Scaffold erection began in

September with a view to getting the building weather-tight for Christmas. "This presented a huge challenge as we had to stop and start the erection of the scaffold in certain areas to allow other contractors to carry out their works," said Darren Lee, managing director of Ideal

Scaffolding (Southern) Ltd. "Due to windy conditions in December, with only 10 days to go until the Christmas shutdown, we had not lifted any roof trusses into place and had run out of room at ground level to erect the remaining five trusses."

Luckily high winds died

down and on December 23 the building had been totally weatherproofed with the last high level fix of monarflex to the full perimeter.

The roofing system used was a Haki 750 complete with gutter system. The scaffold structure was designed by Optima as a permanent structure as the complete project is estimated to take at least four years.

The fire destroyed many of the floors/ceilings which makes access to various areas of the building difficult. Ideal Scaffolding (Southern) Ltd has erected various platforms and staircases to bridge basements and access upper floors. These works will continue throughout the four year project to facilitate the progression of the restoration.

The National Trust plans to breathe new life into the 18th-century mansion.

## Rooms with a view for reno of naval property

This new six storey apartment block will boast spectacular views of Plymouth Sound and is being constructed within the 28 acre grounds of the 200 year-old Admiralty House in Mount Wise Plymouth.

The house was built between 1789 and 1793 and in 1939 the military constructed several buildings – many underground – as it became the headquarters for

Royal Navy and RAF for maritime operations. Post war it continued to be used for Naval operations and command facilities for NATO until 2014 when it became

the latest establishment to be handed back to the city for development.

LTC has employed Optima Scaffold Designs to provide the

design for the external scaffold which is of a tube and fit type, with proprietary Haki loading bays, staircases and birdcages. In addition its Powered Access Division has provided the site with a telehandler and is looking to service the client's powered access requirements in addition to providing the passenger/goods hoists.

Phase 3 of this mixed use regeneration project comprises a six-storey concrete frame apartment block of 59 apartments, including five penthouse units. Residents will enjoy extensive views.

The project is expected to be finished by the summer of 2017. It is part of the wider Mount Wise regeneration plan, transforming naval buildings in the city.



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# Power plant proves to be absorbing work

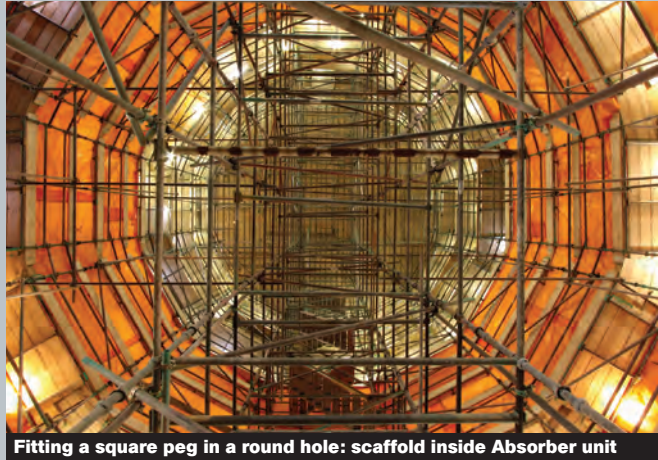

A major project to provide safe and reliable access at a large EDF Energy power plant in Cottam has highlighted the specialist services and advanced solutions provided by Brand Energy and Infrastructure Services (SGB).

The company created a bespoke scaffolding solution for a project to refurbish a Flue-Gas Desulfurization Absorber at the Nottinghamshire power station, and was able to complete the project on schedule despite the complex and demanding nature of the installation.

"The nature of the Absorber unit meant that this was going to be an unusual project right from the start," said Brand Energy's Darren Shepherd. The Absorber is a large cylindrical construction which is used to remove sulphur dioxide from the exhaust flue gases at the plant.

"Our brief was to provide

access to the rubberized interior surfaces of the Absorber, so they could be inspected and refurbished," Shepherd added. "To make matters more challenging, the unit houses a complex network of headers and sprays that rise up some 30 metres, and we had to be extremely careful not to damage

this equipment while working inside the unit. We also completed a series of lagging insulation works on the Absorber unit."

Brand Energy (SGB) used a combination of its own multi-purpose CUPLOK® steel system scaffold and traditional tube and fitting scaffold for the project. "As

the Absorber sits on a floating floor we had to minimise the weight loading on it," Shepherd explained. "By combining the two scaffold systems we were able to keep the overall weight down, and still provide the necessary degree of flexible access to the Absorber's curved internal surfaces. "It was literally a case of constructing the proverbial square peg inside a round hole."

"It's not easy doing a job like this but the team did it beautifully," said EDF Energy's team manager, Boyd Johnson. "The team's efforts allowed us to complete the refurbishment and bring the Absorber back into service after only five weeks, which restricted our production outage to within the planned limits."

The scaffolding team has now completed a similar project on a second Absorber unit at nearby West Burton power station.

# Tubes provide light at the end of the tunnel

Designed tube and fitting access scaffolding has played a vital role for repair works on the approach to Shildon railway tunnel by AMCO Rail.

The original enquiry was for an access scaffold to just the downside retaining wall to allow for vegetation removal, masonry repairs and repointing, but a survey revealed just how restricted access was, having to walk from the nearest access points almost a mile away in either direction. Therefore, the first scaffold erected on site was a system stair tower from cress level to the top of the retaining wall, with stair flights then erected up the embankment, to allow quicker access for personnel to site.

The angle of the wall varied

along its length and therefore tube and fitting was chosen for the access scaffold due to its flexibility. A 180m length, three lift independent was erected which

was fully boarded and covered with debris netting.

On the inside face, the scaffold was cantilevered to match the angle of the wall, with the top lift

being over 3m wide in some locations. To get materials onto the scaffold, a pair of 14m high hoist towers were erected, complete with 500kg goods hoists, extending up the embankment.

An access scaffold was also required to the upside retaining wall, instead of using MEWPs as originally planned. However, the access here was very narrow and prevented use of the same scaffold arrangement as opposite. Instead, the scaffold was erected progressively on a lift by lift basis with just a single outside standard and the inside cantilever section anchored to the wall using shear tie brackets. Access was provided by erecting a bridge section between the two retaining wall scaffolds.





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# Turner Access delivers lights, cameras and action at Edinburgh Festival

For the second year in a row, Turner Access Contracts Division was approached by the Edinburgh International Festival and 59 Productions to supply scaffolding structures for some events taking place during the International Festival's three week programme.

The first structure requested was for the Standard Life Opening Event: Deep Time. This was a free, outdoor artwork created by 59 Productions, in which the western façade of Edinburgh Castle and Castle Rock were used as the canvas for digitally animated projections inspired by the city's past, set to a specially compiled soundtrack.

The second structure required was for a more intimate setting – the main hall at International Festival's headquarters – for cabaret show *Alan Cumming Sings Sappy Songs* and a concert by Mercury Prize-winning band Young Fathers.

There were a number of challenges on both jobs, specifically around the designs of the structures. The opening event required a location from where digital projectors could be housed and positioned to project onto Edinburgh Castle and Castle Rock.

Saltire Court, a Grade A office building directly facing Edinburgh Castle, was selected as the location to house the lighting and projection equipment. Saltire Court has a flat roof, directly above and behind the audience, which was the ideal location for the projectors to be housed.

Turner OCTO® System Scaffolding was used to build a temporary sheeted enclosure to house the digital projectors and protect them from the elements. The sheeted scaffolding had to be secured to the structure of the building; however the scaffold structure could not be fixed to certain parts of the roof because of the material. To overcome these restrictions, the scaffolding was fixed to the underside of a concrete structure in the centre

of the roof using ladder beams joined to the scaffolding and installed through the accessible area underneath the concrete slab.

To access the sheeted scaffolding structure, the Festival team also required a clear walkway to bridge ventilation on the roof.

## Switch back

The events at The Hub presented challenges of a different nature, mainly due to the dual nature of the scaffolding requirement. The first requirement was for a seated structure for audience use during *Alan Cumming Sings Sappy Songs*. This structure featured a tiered platform to accommodate booths and tables for the audience.

After a number of nights in this format, the structure had to change to accommodate a standing terraced platform for concerts from the band Young Fathers. After two performances, the structure had to be converted back to the original setup for the remaining Alan Cumming shows.

The Turner OCTO® System was the ideal solution for this

dual requirement due to its ease of adaptability. There were also space and weight restrictions within the venue that were overcome by the modular design of OCTO®. Turner Access Contracts personnel also conducted additional visits to the venue to install handrails for the terraced standing structure. The planned loading of scaffolding in and out of the venue had to be done 'out of hours' due to the busy location of The Hub.

John Robb, head of technical for the Edinburgh International Festival said: "Turner Access is our go-to company when we have projects that demand structures of this kind. This year's projects were particularly challenging, with very specific details and requirements. Turner Access demonstrated its flexible and creative approach to each problem. We've worked repeatedly with Turner Access over many years, primarily because they are incredibly professional and easy to work with. The crew worked extremely closely with our teams to ensure everything went as planned."

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## Sight at the museum: aesthetics criteria met

The refurbishment of an historic structure at the heart of a busy town centre has called for a scaffold and containment system that had to meet clear objectives.

External stonework repairs on the historic Market Hall Museum in Warwick have seen Sky Scaffolding Midlands Ltd achieve multi-level clear access with important security provision and a high quality of appearance at the same time.

The works for Heritage and Culture Warwickshire – funded by the Heritage Lottery Fund and the Our Warwickshire Project, and undertaken by Novus – called for four scaffold lifts on the external face to optimise free movement around the structure, which is a key consideration for specialist refurbishment work of this type.

“The system we used features a wide bay design

with virtually no cross bracing,” said Dennis Davies, managing director at Sky Scaffolding. “It also allowed aluminium framed steel infill screening panels to be installed on the external face of the scaffold to a height of three metres to create a clear and aesthetically attractive

separation between the building area and the pedestrian pavement immediately alongside.”

A combination of Allround scaffolding and Protect panels from Layher fulfilled this need while the structure also contained a stair system from the

company and provided for the fixing of a materials hoist as well as debris netting to the higher levels.

“Speed of erection has also been an important consideration here as the museum has had clear re-opening target dates from the start,” added Davies. “Our choice of equipment, we believe, cut installation time by some 75% compared with a tube and fitting alternative.”

The project in Warwick is an excellent example of Sky Scaffolding’s focus on historic building refurbishment. “Such work always calls for a combination of creative thinking and experience to provide the optimum access solution and we are delighted to have been involved in such a highly prestigious project in an important location,” concluded Davies.

## Beam me up: world first for Reading renovation

The world’s first use of a new heavy duty aluminium beam design is helping to transform the old ‘Yell House’ office building in Reading for Crown Student Living to create ‘Queen’s Court’ which will provide accommodation for 395 students. The beam – from Layher – has been used both as a support for the scaffold structure above and, vitally, as a means of maintaining full public access to the on-site car park throughout the 11-month refurbishment programme.

The project on the L-shaped building, under the management of Osborne, has featured a total of 16 boarded lifts rising to 30 metres. The car park within, which serves one of Reading’s main shopping centres, is accessed via an entry and exit tunnel at one of

end of the main 50-metre façade – neither of which could be closed off at any point. Archway Services used the HD beam structure across the two adjacent openings,

with no road closures or overnight work required.

Supporting scaffold towers at each end of the beam and a third support structure at the centre

point allowed the two wide access tunnels to be created – large enough for shop delivery vehicles – while leg load capacities of 116 kN enabled the full scaffold structure above to be supported.

A full scaffold access to every face of the building was created which was then clad in fire retardant sheeting. Only minimal cross-bracing was required. The system also enabled the workforce to accommodate a series of bay windows that project outwards from the building. Additionally, a full width fan structure provided protection across both the main car park entrance and exit and above a second archway created over a further access road at the rear of the building.





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# JDC demonstrates the art of scaffolding

Following a successful working relationship on previous Central London projects, JDC Scaffolding was approached by Sisk in early 2015 to provide design advice and budget costings for the refurbishment of iconic London building, The Royal Academy of Arts in Piccadilly.

The original project specification involved extensive stone repairs to the front façade, new construction to the rear of the building, the demolition and remodelling of the east and west cores and the construction of a new lecture theatre. The original scaffold brief was to provide access for these works inclusive of temporary roofs over both cores.

As the project developed the Royal Academy asked for budgets to replace the coverings to the remaining roofs. Due to the differing interfaces, locations, heights and pitches of these

roofs, JDC Scaffolding suggested that they would look into the possibility of covering the whole roof area utilising a rolling Haki 750 solution. The temporary roof was required to provide waterproof coverage during the works but was also designed to allow roof sheets to be easily

retracted to expose openings in the roof structure to allow crane lifting of materials to the working area.

This technically challenging roof was developed alongside RDG Engineering to arrive at a workable solution for the required 47m x 39m single span. The existing

structure has a number of high level features which meant that a normal tubular tie chord solution could not be utilised, the roof was tied instead with an innovative system of cables and bespoke, fabricated tie plates. Due to the layout of the building it was not possible to construct a working platform and roll out the roof in the normal manner from one end, it was therefore decided to work from the centre of the roof and roll out in two directions.

Nigel Warnes, construction director of Sisk, said: "Sisk has worked closely with JDC on a number of projects over the past five years and developed an excellent working relationship. Given the challenges/prestige of the RAA project we decided to appoint JDC due to our relationships and its proactive 'can do' attitude which can be seen in the quality of its work on site."

# Platforms and penthouses pose challenges

A striking 18-storey tower is the standout feature of Telford Homes's collection of 148 apartments, penthouses and villas located in London's newest property hotspot Bermondsey SE16. With the external façades being finished with both cladding and render, Connect Scaffolding provided the access solution to deliver safe working platforms, staircases, loading bays and hoist towers for use by multiple trades.

Over 8,500 linear metres of scaffold were installed to provide multi-level access. Due to the extent of render to the external façades, one of the key challenges Connect faced was in designing the scaffold with minimal ties. Given the loads imposed by the 55m high

scaffold, plus additional wind load and the significant load imposed by the passenger and goods hoist that would be tied to the scaffold, the design teams from Connect

and system supplier Layher developed a scheme using double standards connected via twin wedge-heads from ground up to the 11th floor before

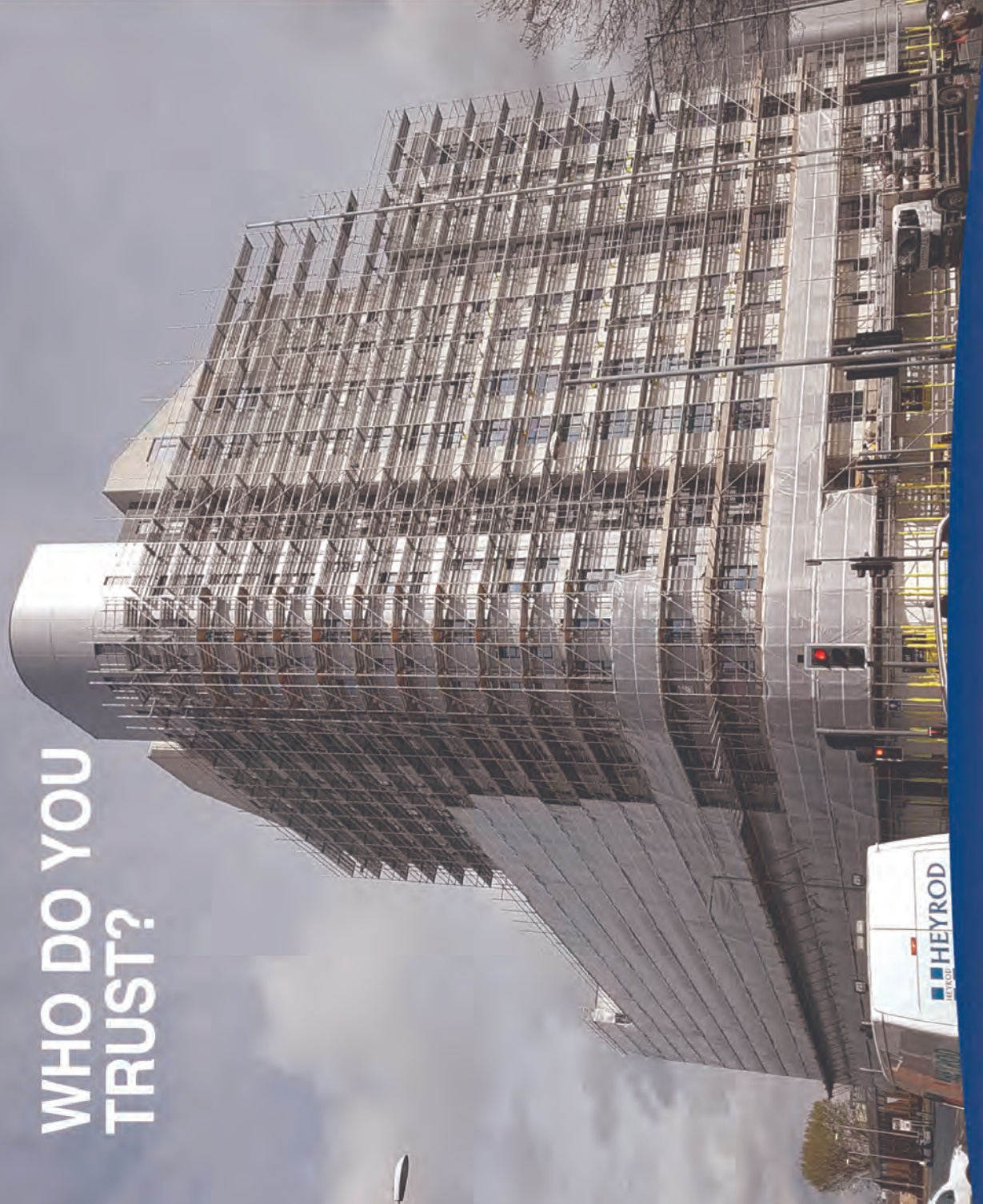
tapering the scaffold back to single standards above. Cluster columns of four standards were introduced for the hoist support and run off tower, further strengthening the scaffold to withstand loads and allow works to be carried out on multiple levels simultaneously.

With the design solution allowing the ties to be greatly reduced, the erection speed of the system worked in tandem with the experience of the on-site team to ensure Connect was able to deliver the scaffold within programme and budget.

Shaun Perry, Telford Homes plc, project manager said: "The system proved very quick to erect and helped us recover some delays after handing over some areas later than anticipated."



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# Off site mock-up helps contractor meet best practice demands from client

In February 2015, Denholm Industrial Services was approached by Kier Construction to provide a compliant bid for the common user external access package for the Beckley Court student accommodation project in Plymouth.

The build is due for completion in September 2017, and is set to become the tallest building in Plymouth after the Civic Centre.

The new student accommodation will provide 500 en-suite, high quality student rooms. The tower design has a layered splay approach with a stronger connection at ground level. The tower's corner will protrude out of the ground with recesses on either side. It will be crowned with a common room above the top floor.

As with most high rise construction projects, space is at a premium; the site is surrounded by existing buildings, sits in one of Plymouth's busiest thoroughfares and is adjacent to the main pedestrian access to the railway station.

**“To ensure design buildability, a mock-up was constructed. It allowed the scaffolders and site supervisor to have familiarity with the scheme, provide feedback and contribute to the method of erection. It also provided an opportunity to practise fan installation.”**

Kier was clear that the scheme was to be a quality bid, utilising industry best practice, accommodating a multitude of trades, minimal adaptations and must meet the critical path of the programme.

## Reaching a pinnacle

Denholm's senior manager produced the competitive and compliant bid and would ensure successful transition from bid to delivery. Optima Design Services have provided the design which provides for an eight board wide scaffold built over 24, 2.9m-high lifts with an additional five 2.1m-high lifts to complete the Pinnacle feature above the building's top floor.

The 3,200 linear metres of scaffold were designed without

a single cross brace to enable access for men and materials by utilising ready-fix transoms. The design also enabled the scaffold to support two 1500kg hoists as well as two sets of safety net fans.

The confined nature of the site meant conventional fan protection was not viable and would obstruct lifting operations.

Denholm installed two levels of safety fans that could be withdrawn to the vertical and re-deployed after lifting operations had been completed. The Maxi-net fan is permanently installed at the second floor and extends 4.6m beyond the scaffold line, whilst the standard width fan extends 3m and is moved progressively with the scaffold build.

To ensure design buildability, a mock-up was constructed at Denholm's Plymouth branch. It allowed the scaffolders and site supervisor Ross Couling, to obtain familiarity with the scheme, provide feedback and contribute to the method of erection.

All feedback and lessons learnt were incorporated within

the final method statement with photographs used to detail each stage. It also provided an opportunity to practise fan installation and fully-assisted rescue procedures using a 100kg mannequin, complete with full PPE.

## Staying on site

Kier installed a 2.4m-wide concrete plinth to the building's perimeter to cope with the 28kN leg loads.

Construction began at the start of May 2016. Denholm's senior manager spent the first two weeks of the construction on site working closely with the site delivery team ensuring his knowledge and experience were passed seamlessly to the operatives.

All lifting of material was done by Denholm CPCS-qualified slingers who worked closely with Kier's lifting teams to ensure only the minimum of material were kept on site.

Kier Construction and Denholm's goal on site was one of collaboration and partnering ensuring the project was a success for everyone.



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# All hands on deck for Mary Rose modifications

▶ **THE MARY ROSE** NASC MEMBER GKR SCAFFOLDING MAIN CONTRACTOR COMO

GKR Scaffolding was awarded the scaffolding works to enable the modification of the existing 'hot box' around the Mary Rose hull. This phase of development includes the removal of the internal roof structure and modification to the walls between the ship and visitors, which was required to be achieved within a controlled environment.

To access the various materials needed to allow the total modification, GKR installed a one tonne goods hoist from ground level to the boat deck level which was fully encapsulated with a temporary roof structure to keep the environment dry allowing hoist movement within the enclosed zone.

To allow the removal of the 'hot box' a 42 metre long by 14 metres high scaffold structure was built from the boat deck

level on the north side. This also provided support for the existing observation walkway allowing for its replacement. On the south wall, a bridged scaffold with support towers was installed to enable the installation of glazing along the viewing galleries on all three levels. This had to be

achieved whilst maintaining clear access for the two site based Pelloby mobile cranes to allow their movement. This was achieved in two stages.

Upon completion of the removal of the existing 'hot box' walls, GKR installed a rolling 12 metres long by six metres wide

bridged crash deck spanning north to south over the hull; the rolling gantry was built from the west end of the ship's hull away from the Mary Rose itself, and then rolled out over the ship. This was achieved by erecting running tracks to the north and south elevation scaffolds allowing access for the internal roof removal, the roof was removed piece by piece with the Mary Rose fully protected.

Once the project was completed, all the scaffold was carefully dismantled stage by stage allowing the Mary Rose to be seen in all its glory.

GKR used in excess of 150 tonnes of scaffold tube, 12,000 scaffold fittings, 1,000 scaffold boards and 550 metres of modular scaffold beams all accessed in and out of the building with a transit route of 200 metres via narrow corridors and access routes.

# Birmingham bank job proves complex

Extensive and innovative scaffolding has been designed and installed at the major demolition project at the one of the tallest buildings in Birmingham City Centre: the Nat West Tower.

The principle contractor H Smith Engineers Ltd appointed SES to design and construct scaffold solutions to enable access for this complex project.

The building is in a very confined city centre environment with numerous obstacles to overcome, including difficult access and several podium roofs and adjacent property roofs.

In addition four basement levels required extensive back propping solutions to allow a 250 feet high scaffold to be constructed to the office tower.

The task was far from straightforward.

The Nat West tower was constructed in 1975 and was amongst the most iconic

buildings in the city. It has sat unused since 2003 waiting for planning to be granted for the new structure that will deliver a 35-storey

modern office and retail building.

SES soon established that heavy duty designed street gantries and protection fans would be required at several levels to be installed progressively as the scaffold was constructed. In addition SES designed and erected primary truss out beam work from high level floors to support secondary prefabricated beam spans over adjacent property roofs.

H Smith project manager Nick Francis said: "This project is one of the most complex demolition works I have been involved in. The access works are one of the most difficult aspects. Having worked with SES I am grateful they have brought their vast experience to the table."



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# Prompt response puts hotel back in business

When North Oxford-based K Scaffolding was given the contract to provide scaffolding for a major refurbishment of the Randolph Hotel in Oxford, the company could have had no inkling that, within a few weeks, the job would escalate to become a year-long job of an entirely different kind.

On Friday 17 April 2015, just weeks after work had started, the Grade II, 150 year old Victorian Gothic, Randolph Hotel suffered a serious fire which caused damage throughout the building, not least to the roof structure which was beyond repair and needed to be replaced.

The fire started in the kitchen when chefs used too much cognac to flambé a beef stroganoff. The ensuing flame was sucked into a vent and the building was ignited and it took 14 fire engines to bring the fire under control.

"I received a call that evening and by the following morning we had staff and equipment on hand to help with emergency repairs," says Allan Broom, managing director of K Scaffolding. "One of the most urgent tasks was to provide a temporary roof to allow reconstruction work to

commence and minimise any further internal damage from water ingress."

With a system roof in stock, it took only days to organise the placement of the temporary roof and, impressively, just one day for it to be craned into position.

The Randolph Hotel is in a

very busy part of Oxford so it was important to minimise the disruption to traffic and pedestrians; the road was only closed for the day while the crane was working. Use of traditional CI sheeting would have taken weeks with significantly more disruption and inconvenience to Oxford's traffic.

With the temporary roof in position, work could begin on repairs and, due to the ability of K Scaffolding to provide such a prompt service, the hotel was able to re-open after just three weeks.

"K Scaffolding's ability to provide the temporary roof from stock made a major contribution to reducing the repair time needed to allow the hotel to re-open," concludes Broom.

Since then, K Scaffolding has continued to provide scaffolding as the hotel undergoes a major refurbishment.

# Beams make tricky viaduct challenge viable

Sharnbrook railway viaduct crosses the River Great Ouse between Bedford and Wellingborough. It is a steel structure built on a flood plain.

When Network Rail appointed J Murphy to carry out bridge strengthening and painting works to the viaduct, they knew that it would require a great deal of expertise to carry out the works safely and on budget.

The fact that it is built on a flood plain meant that no scaffold could be erected off the ground. In addition to this was the added difficulty that the steelwork was being replaced so the simple solution of suspending the scaffold off the structure was not possible.

The other major problem was that a crane or telehandler could not be used to lift any beams into position. JFE Attridge Scaffolding Services came up with the

solution of erecting support scaffolds drilled and fixed directly to the piers of the structure. In total each pier required 500 drilled anchors to be installed.

Once the supports were in place a safe system of work was developed to enable Haki 750 beams to be manually installed spanning between the support towers.

On the whole of the job a total 3,000 LM of beams were used. The solution gave unimpeded access to the steelwork and enabled the job to be completed safely and on time.

The Midland main line, which runs from London St Pancras to Sheffield, is due to be fully electrified by December 2020 in a £1.6bn programme of work that will see overhead electrical wires being fitted along the length of the line. Bridges along the route will be altered to allow for the extra clearance needed for the wires.





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# Damage limitation for Chelsea Pensioners

Coventry Scaffolding started working with the Royal Hospital Chelsea in September 2015. The purpose of the scaffold was to allow the lead work on both the roofs and around the dormer windows to be replaced.

The Royal Hospital Chelsea is a retirement home for the Chelsea Pensioners: some 300 British Soldiers from the British Army. The building first opened as a hospital to war veterans in 1692, as a result of King Charles II's vision that the country is eternally indebted to its old soldiers. Originally designed by Sir Christopher Wren, the current building was expanded in the 19th century using the designs of Sir John Sloane. It is a Grade II listed building and a photographic survey of the building and surrounding pavements had to be made before work began, in case of any damage.

Preventing damage and retaining the historic integrity of the building was paramount, and Coventry Scaffolding was challenged by the restriction of not being able to tie directly onto the structure. It solved this issue by designing the scaffolding using buttresses. The sheer scale and

nature of the site posed their own problems – large swathes of this impressive 66 acres, are grass and unpaved space, meaning transportation of materials to some areas was difficult. An all-terrain forklift truck had to be used to take the materials to where they were needed on site.

Coventry's scaffolders were warmly welcomed by the residents of The Royal Hospital Chelsea; the Pensioners chatted to scaffold workers and showed a keen interest in the refurbishment being carried out on their historic home.

Work had to be completed to a tight schedule - the scaffolding around Figure Court had to be dismantled prior to the 324th annual Founders Day Parade' in May, a prestigious event always attended by a member of the British Royal Family. The Princess Royal was this year's royal attendee and Coventry's Chairman, Paul Hanifan, was delighted to be invited too. A magnificent parade of the Chelsea Pensioners in their famous red coats took place under sunny skies in Figure Court, overlooked by their newly refurbished accommodation blocks.

# Façade access challenge fixed by design

Brogan Group is currently providing an all-encompassing access solution incorporating scaffolding, mast climbers and goods /passenger hoists on Phase 1 of the Battersea Power Station development.

Circus West, as it is known involves the construction of a mix of 866 apartments, including 11 penthouses, retail facilities, theatre space and business studios. The two blocks vary in height from eight to 18 storeys and are built on a podium with two levels of basement parking.

Brogan Group designed a scheme and erected a large gantry to support mast climber platforms used for cladding the elevation that runs parallel to the Battersea Park station to Victoria rail line. Mast climbers were

chosen for this elevation due to the close proximity of the rail line for safety and to minimise risk of distraction to train drivers. A combination of twin and single

machines have been installed, several of which have sliding platforms to enable operatives to navigate past protruding balconies. The building also

curves slightly, therefore, the mast climbers were erected to follow the curved perimeter of the building. Standard mast ties would get in the way of the glazing and copper façade panels as they are quite large, therefore, specially fabricated brackets to raker down to the top of the balcony locations were designed and installed.

Brogan Group is supplying 17 hoists to feed the blocks that make up RS1A and RS1B. The hoists serve the staggered blocks tying into the recessed fissures to enable works to continue on the surrounding façades. With maximum payloads of 2.7t and varied cage sizes and capacities ranging from 3.2m to 3.8m in length, the hoists allow for the fit out on all floors.





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# Making the grade

Being a member of the NASC demonstrates commitment to stringent practice and compliance with a rigorous set of standards which clients are increasingly specifying. Below is the membership criteria.

**N**ASC membership is open to all bona fide UK registered access and scaffolding companies. Full membership is open to all companies where access and scaffolding constitutes a significant element of their business. Applicants must be registered with ConstructionSkills as defined in Schedule 1 of the Industrial Training (Construction Board) Order 1964 (Amendment) Order 1982. Multi-disciplined companies who conform with the above criteria are eligible for membership providing the scaffolding division can be audited independently, including the provision of management accounts. The application must relate to the scaffolding division only.

Non Contracting Full membership of the NASC is restricted to companies which are wholly engaged in the hire, sale, and manufacturing of access and scaffolding and associated products. It excludes companies who also carry out erection and dismantling work.

In order to become a member an applicant has to be able to demonstrate that they have met the following criteria during the 12 months prior to application:

## **a) Trading**

The applicant has to have been trading for two full years as a limited liability company and needs to be able to produce financial statements prepared by the company accountants to the board of Directors for the period.

## **b) VAT**

The applicant must be VAT registered.

## **c) Insurance**

The applicant must hold adequate levels of insurance appropriate to the turnover and wages of the business which includes a minimum Public Liability of 5 million and Employers' Liability of 10 million.

## **d) Employment**

The applicant must be able to show that all management and supervision are directly employed (PAYE). A minimum of 75% of all yard and site operatives must be directly employed as a condition of membership.

## **e) Training**

The NASC is committed to the full registration of site employees under the CISRS scheme. Applicants must be able to produce records and evidence of previously completed training to meet the following minimum requirements:

- Minimum 90% of the scaffolding workforce



must hold a current CISRS card. This includes scaffolding labourers, trainee scaffolders, scaffolders and advanced scaffolders either PAYE or subcontract.

- Minimum 50% of the scaffolding workforce (excluding yard staff and drivers) must hold either a Scaffolder or Advanced Scaffolder card.
- The lead hand of a scaffold gang using system scaffolding must have successfully completed the relevant CISRS Systems product training.
- All applicants must demonstrate their commitment to the continued training and development of the workforce and provide evidence to support this.

## **f) CITB**

The applicant must be registered with CITB for levy purposes.

## **g) Health and Safety**

The applicant must:

- Provide a satisfactory Health & Safety policy that meets current Health & Safety legislation.
- Provide a Risk Assessment and Method Statement that is compliant with the CDM Regulations 2015.
- Provide evidence of a satisfactory Health & Safety management system. Agree to complete the NASC annual accident return.

## **h) Audit**

The applicant must complete the NASC biennial membership audit and the biennial self certification audit.

## **i) Security**

The applicant must ensure that all scaffolding plant and equipment which it owns or uses is clearly identifiable.

NASC members are expected to be actively involved in crime prevention and should report all thefts of scaffolding plant and equipment to the NASC and the police.

## **j) Meeting Attendance**

The applicant must be represented by a senior member of staff at a minimum of one NASC regional meeting per calendar year. The applicant must be prepared to nominate a representative to participate in NASC standing committees e.g. training, health and safety, technical and contractual.

## **k) Construction Industry Joint Council (CIJC)**

Members shall operate terms and conditions of employment in accordance with agreements reached from time to time by the Construction Industry Joint Council or its successors, or broadly equivalent terms and conditions, as a minimum requirement.

## **l) Code of Conduct**

Applicants must be prepared to abide by the NASC Code of Conduct and the NASC Bye Laws and Rules.

## **m) Management & Supervision**

The applicant must provide evidence of how the company manages and supervises its workforce effectively (this must include actual documented evidence of ongoing supervision records). ■



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# Rules of engagement

Adherence to the following Code of Conduct is a condition of membership of the National Access and Scaffolding Confederation.

## STANDARDS

**1** Members of the NASC shall at all times so order their conduct as to uphold the integrity and trading standards of the access and scaffolding industry and pay particular regard to the maintenance and observance of this code.

**2** Service to clients shall be rendered with absolute fidelity on a fair and equitable basis with due regard to the best standards of workmanship, integrity and courtesy. The utmost care and good faith shall be observed in the preparation of statements and estimates, having regard to the necessity for accuracy and reliability of such documents in providing a basis for transactions to be carried out with the full confidence and mutual trust of the parties concerned.

**3** In the interest of the parties, all contracts and agreements, together with any alterations thereto shall, whenever possible, be in writing.

## NASC MATTERS

**1** Members shall be loyal to the interests of the NASC and shall play an active part in the work of the NASC, attend and participate at meetings. A minimum requirement is attendance at one NASC regional meeting per annum. They shall be prepared to accept nomination to office and generally further the interests of the NASC and its members.

**2** A Member shall not divulge or disclose confidential information from NASC sources to non-members.

**3** Should a Member at any time be asked by resolution of Council to explain his conduct in any matter to which the Code relates he shall submit all pertinent facts to the Officers or Committee nominated for that purpose.

**4** No Member shall consciously endeavour to attract or offer employment to an employee of a fellow Member without first having advised the fellow Member; but membership of the NASC in no way prohibits negotiation between any member and a person who on his own initiative, or in response to public advertisement, replies to that Member for employment.

**5** Members shall operate terms and conditions of employment in accordance with agreements reached from time to time by the Construction Industry Joint Council or its successors, or broadly equivalent terms and conditions, as a minimum. Members shall abide by such statutory wage controls



as may apply in respect of all employees, and shall take all reasonable steps to ensure wherever possible and practicable that the specified proportions of their labour force are operated on a 'directly employed' basis, as a minimum.

**6** A Member shall guard against association with or the use of his name by any person or organisation which it might reasonably be anticipated would bring the NASC into disrepute.

**7** Members shall refrain from publicly expressing critical comment on the services, conduct or charges of a fellow Member.

**8** Members shall accept the duty of referring to the Managing Director of the NASC any breach of this Code which may appear likely to bring discredit on the NASC or its members.

**9** Members shall pledge themselves to assist each other in all matters of common concern and to provide the Managing Director of the NASC with such statistics and other information as may from time to time be requested.

**10** Training in the range of skills required by the trade shall be accepted as a collective responsibility and Members shall play their part in upholding and improving standards by participation especially in training schemes sponsored or recommended by the Council of the NASC.

**11** Members shall use their best endeavors to identify other members' items of capital equipment and scaffolding stocks which may come into their possession. If any such items are identifiable by colour, names or distinguishing marks as shown in the NASC Scaffolding Marking Directory, then members shall notify the Member to whom they belong. Members shall undertake to return such items to other members who can prove ownership.

**12** Dealings in secondhand scaffolding equipment by members shall be closely checked and a member shall not purchase or offer for sale or hire any item properly identified as belonging to another member without that member's prior written permission. Any such permission must be confirmed in writing with the owner, partner, or director of the member company whose equipment is being offered for purchase, sale or hire.

**13** Safety is of paramount importance and members shall maintain, operate and review as necessary, a safety policy which takes account of current health and safety regulations, standards, codes of practice and guidance issued from time to time by the NASC. ■

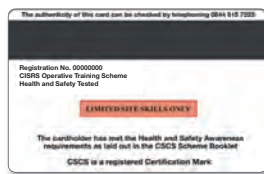

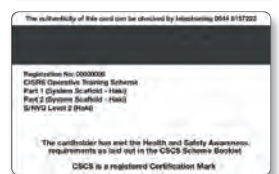
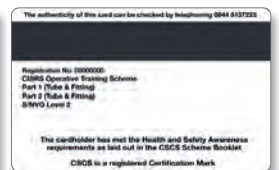
## Scaffolding Labourer

The holder of this card can only carry out labouring duties, in support of scaffolding operations.  
If working off the ground they must do so from a completed, fully boarded and double guard railed section of the scaffold platform. They must not erect, dismantle or alter scaffold structures in anyway.  
Scaffolding labourers are required to attend a CISRS 1 Day New Entrant Course (COTS) and have passed a recognised H&S Test.



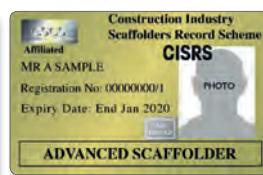
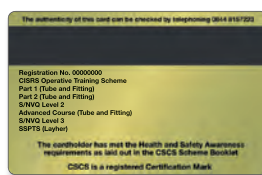
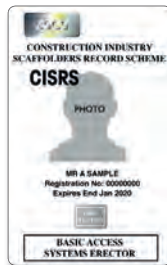
## Scaffolder

The holder of this card has successfully reached Scaffolder status, this enables them to lead or partake in scaffolding operations covered by their training and assessment, which includes independents, towers, birdcages, fans, gantry & beam work etc.  
Scaffolders who have qualified via the tube and fitting route can attend Systems Scaffold Product Training Scheme (SSPTS) 2 day courses, and have these qualifications endorsed on the rear of the card. Please see note on Systems Training to ensure that the operative holds the correct system endorsement.  
Scaffolders who qualify through the systems route e.g. Part 1 Haki, Part 2 Haki are only eligible to work with the systems endorsed on the rear of the card.



## Basic Access Systems Erector (Base)

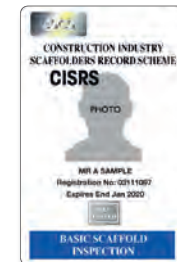
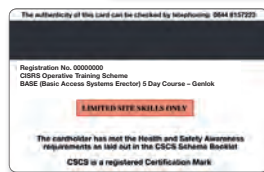
This is a limited skills card for non scaffolding operatives who may be required to erect, dismantle or alter simple system scaffold structures.  
There are limitations on height, type of structure, location and system used. Any tube and fitting scaffold or system structures outside of those covered in the BASE course must be carried out by a CISRS qualified Scaffolder.

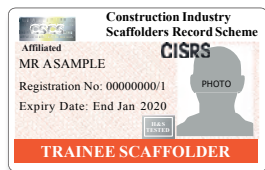
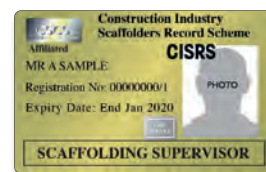
The holder of this card has successfully reached Advanced Scaffolder status, this enables them to lead or partake in all types of Basic and Complex scaffolding operations including but not restricted to suspended scaffolds, temporary roofs and support structures. These structures can be erected in system scaffold provided the operative's card has been endorsed with the relevant endorsement.

BASE card holders are required to attend a CISRS 1 Day New Entrant Course (COTS) and have passed a recognised H&S Test.  
Rear of card will be endorsed with training undertaken to date.  
Please see note on system training to ensure operative holds the relevant system endorsement.



## Scaffold Supervisor

The holder of this card has successfully completed the CISRS 5 Day Supervisors course, the content is similar to SMSTS (Site Manager Safety Training Scheme) but is scaffold specific. It covers Health and Safety Legislation, Performance Standards, Basic Employment Rights, Supervisory Skills & Commercial Elements.  
Delegates are required to sit a written test on each subject and also submit a project which contributes to the overall assessment.



## Trainee Scaffolder

The holder of this card is currently undergoing CISRS Scaffolder training and assessment. They are entitled to work as part of a scaffold gang under the direct supervision of a CISRS Scaffolder or Advanced Scaffolder.  
Trainee scaffolders are required to attend a CISRS 1 Day New Entrant Course (COTS) and have passed a recognised H&S Test.  
The rear of the card will be endorsed with training undertaken to date. Part 1 and 2 training can be undertaken in both tube & fitting and recognised system scaffold products.  
Please see note on Systems Training to ensure that the operative holds the correct system endorsement.  
Note: An operative is considered a trainee until they have completed Part 1 and 2 training, S/NNQ Level 2, CISRS assessment skills test and have passed a recognised H&S Test.

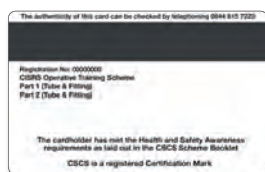
## Scaffold Inspection

The holder of the Basic Scaffold Inspection card is qualified to carry out statutory inspections of Basic structures, independent scaffolds, scaffold tower, birdcage scaffolds etc.  
The Advanced Scaffold Inspection card allows the holder to carry out statutory inspections on both Basic and Complex structures e.g. suspended scaffolds, temporary roofs etc.

## Systems Training

Systems Scaffold Product Training Scheme (SSPTS) 2 day courses are available in recognised system scaffold products. Operatives who hold a BASE, Scaffolder and Advanced Scaffolder card are eligible to attend these courses as are Trainee cardholders who have completed Part 1 training. Recognised Systems Products are split into various types. Details of recognised systems products, system types and the requirements for additional training can be found on the CISRS website.

This year has been an interesting one for SAEMA. Whilst we have continued to pursue our primary aim of providing the façade access industry safe places of work, a number of critical changes have taken place within the organisation.

Our long-serving and well respected secretary, Trevor Fennell, has decided to retire. Trevor has been an enthusiastic supporter of SAEMA and suspended access systems for many years, and has been crucial in the success enjoyed by the organisation. We wish him well in his retirement.

Tony Seddon has been appointed as secretary, and brings with him an extensive knowledge of work at height. Tony is secretary of a number of work at height trade associations, and is also a director of the Access Industry Forum, of which SAEMA is a member.

Tony will continue Trevor's good work, and will help the officers and members drive SAEMA on to new heights.

SAEMA Members continue to rise to the challenge of ever more complex building designs and continue to provide excellent service to clients and contractors alike.

## Projects

The start of the year saw a number of projects and targets set by the officers of the Association.

A skilled workforce is crucial to the success of any industry sector. SAEMA recognises this, and has continued its strategic alliances with existing providers,

and has developed new partnerships aimed at driving excellence in the industry.

We continue to provide training courses at the CITB Training Centre at Bircham Newton, which are primarily aimed at the staff of SAEMA member companies. Examples of this are:

- The SAEMA/CITB Permanently Installed Cradle System Testers & Examiners Course
- The SAEMA/CITB Basic Hydraulics Course.
- The Permanently Installed Cradle Users Training Course.
- A seminar for 'Duty Holders' on their legal responsibilities regarding the façade access systems that they have under their administration.

SAEMA has also formed a partnership with SpanSet, and is using their Cheshire facilities to provide the Temporarily Installed Cradle Riggers Course. Candidates are trained over a number of weeks by our expert trainer Robert Snailham, and are ultimately assessed to receive a Level 2 NVQ in Temporary Cradle Rigging, and ultimately a CSCS card to verify their qualification on site.

SAEMA has continued its active involvement with the Access Industry Forum, and has been pivotal in the launch of AIF's first Work at Height Conference. With Tony's involvement in AIF we are sure this relationship with the other primary work at height organisations will be of benefit to the industry.

SAEMA has retained its membership of Build UK. Through its contractor and client members, we are aiming to raise awareness of the issue of Construction Phase Use. SAEMA maintains that principal contractors must understand that the equipment we supply is not construction plant and should not be used as such. SAEMA discourages Construction Phase Use for a number of reasons, but primarily, the BMU is not intended for this activity, and therefore safety can be compromised. The equipment can also see what equates to many years service being encountered in the first few months of life. SAEMA will be working with Build UK to resolve this issue.

The issue of early consultation with SAEMA members is high on our radar. Early consultation by architects and contractors leads to a more thought out approach,

and can potentially save both client and contractor money.

## Technical Committee

SAEMA continues to compile guidance documents for use in our industry, all of which are freely available on our website – [www.saema.net](http://www.saema.net). We have been working on titles such as *SAEMA Guidance on the Management Control and Use of Temporary Installed Suspended Access Equipment*.

I would like to personally thank all those members who have given their time freely to provide such comprehensive guidance.

The members of the committee have contributed to the reviews of BS 6037 and BS 5974 and the amendments to BS EN 1808, and will continue to work on industry standards in the coming months and years.

We are also working on the issue of log books for access equipment, with an aim to have a SAEMA document approved by the committee for use before the end of 2016.

## SAEMA and the Future

SAEMA Membership continues to be the voice of the suspended access industry, representing over 90% of companies involved in the permanently installed cradle market, and more than 60% of the temporary installed cradle market place. I look forward to rising to the challenges presented, and working with the members and officers in the coming months and years. ■

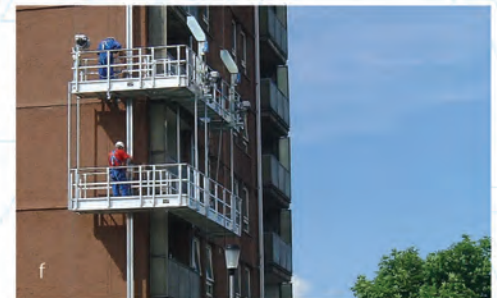

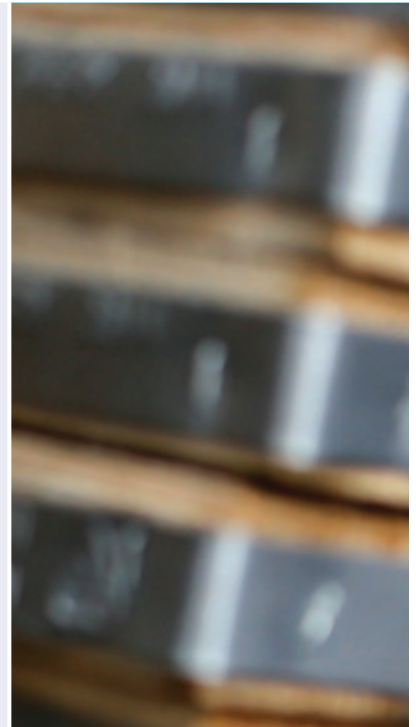

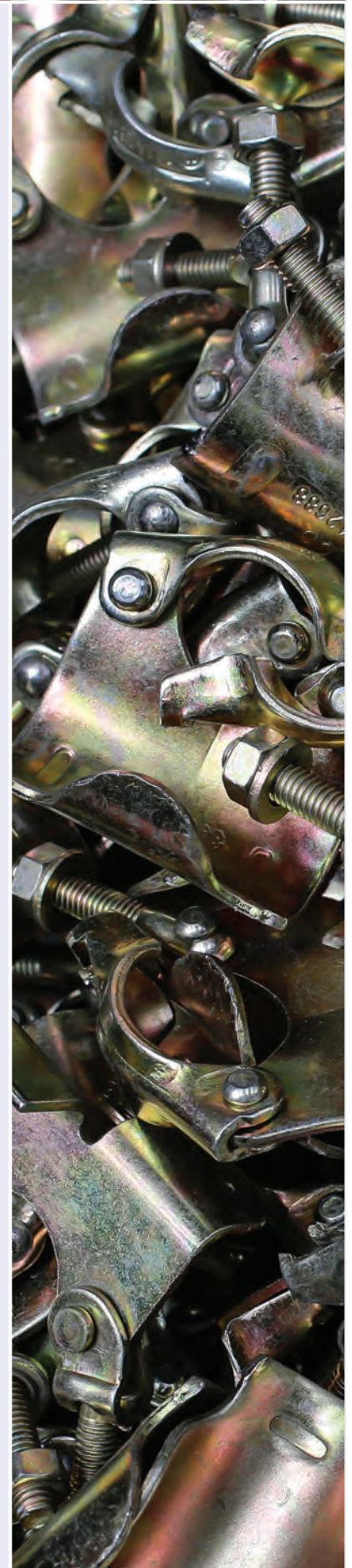
