Reporting of Theft to the Police



The Confederation has produced a standard form which can be used by Members to report incidents of theft to the Police. The form is attached to the rear of this Guidance note, and can be freely copied for use. Police Officers assisted in the design of the form which contains the information they require to record details of a crime and issue a Crime reference number.

Please note the following:

- 1. All identified thefts of material should be reported to the Police.
- 2. Major thefts should be reported by telephone in the first instance, using the local non-urgent telephone line. They may require the attendance of a Police Officer.
- Criminal incidents in progress should also be immediately reported by telephone by using the '999' system.
- 4. Non urgent or more minor matters can also be reported by telephone using the local non-urgent telephone line. Most Police Stations have a Crime Desk or Crime Bureau who will take details of the offence and issue a Crime number.
- There is usually no need for members to attend at a Police Station to report a crime unless specifically requested. In such cases, it is advisable to confirm the report by faxing or e-mailing a copy of the NASC form to the Crime Desk.
- 6. Please provide as full a description of the material stolen as possible, including quantities, identifying marking, paint colours, and replacement value.
- 7. It is also advisable to visit the scene of the offence and seek information or witnesses to the incident. The Police may not always do this in minor offences.
- 8. Please send a copy of every reported theft to the NASC by fax or e-mail. Due to Police area boundaries, they may not pick up patterns of scaffold-related theft. These can sometimes be identified by Security Committee members who can make Police aware, and circulate local members to warn them of a possible problem.
- 9. Even if there is nothing stolen, or the matter does not require Police attention, please inform the NASC. It may help other members in the area.
- 10. If you receive information relating to criminal activity, please inform a member of the Security Committee, who will advise (confidentially) if any further action is required.
- 11. E-Mail is now a recognised and convenient means of communication and will enable messages to be passed quickly between NASC/regions/members and Police.
